AB 210 - Board Bill - Revisions to NRS 634

Chiropractic Physicians'

Examination Dates



2021 Legislative Session

<u>Assembly Bill 210</u> was passed and is effective January 1, 2022. This bill adds new language and amends several sections to NRS Chapter 634.

- <u>Section 2</u> defines "business entity" for the provisions relating to the practice of chiropractic. For the purposes of this new law, only chiropractic practices that are *NOT* wholly owned by chiropractic physicians, allopathic physicians, or osteopathic physicians (or any combination of the three) to be registered with the Board. Chiropractic practices wholly owned by chiropractic physicians, allopathic physicians, or osteopathic physicians (or any combination of the three) are not required to register with the Board.
- Section 3 requires a business entity that provides chiropractic services to be registered, inspected, and regulated.
- <u>Section 3</u> requires a business entity to notify the Board of any change to certain information submitted as part of an application for registration.
- <u>Section 4</u> requires a registered business entity to:
 - (1) ensure that all chiropractic physicians and chiropractic assistants who provide chiropractic services in any facility owned or operated by the business entity comply with the provisions of existing law and regulations that govern the practice of chiropractic;
 - (2) establish a written policy and procedure relating to the medical records of a patient; and
 - (3) notify the Board if the business entity dissolves or a facility owned or operated by the business entity closes.
- Existing law provides grounds for initiating disciplinary action against practitioners of chiropractic. (NRS 634.018, 634.140) **Sections 9-15** of this bill make various changes to authorize the imposition of disciplinary action against a registered business entity, as applicable.

NRS 634.090 was amended to and is shown in the three sections:

<u>First</u>, the change in subsection 1 strikes old language that identified specific subject matters of colleges of chiropractic and defers to the curriculum at the college of chiropractic which is accredited by the CCE (Council on Chiropractic Education).

<u>Second</u>, the new language in subsection (2) authorizes an experienced chiropractic physician (working at least 7 of the preceding 10 years) who passed his or her examinations at a time when Parts III and IV of the NBCE examination did not exist when he or she became licensed.

<u>Third</u>, the change in subsection (6) adds language to ensure that foreign graduates who have taken a course of study consisting of at least 4,000 hours and produces a degree of doctor of chiropractic can seek licensure.

- NRS 634.220 was amended to authorize chiropractic physicians to recommend, dispense, or administer any drug or device for which the prescription or order of a practitioner is not required by federal or state law. This was intended to confirm in the Board's practice act that chiropractic physicians' can lawfully recommend and sell lawful overthe-counter products.
- NRS 634.090 was amended to and is shown in the following three sections:
 - the change in subsection 1 strikes old language that identified specific subject matters of colleges of chiropractic and defers to the curriculum established by the CCE (Council on Chiropractic Education).
 - o the new language in subsection (2) authorizes an experienced chiropractic physician (working at least 7 of the preceding 10 years) who passed his or her examinations at a time when Parts III and IV of the NBCE examination did not exist when he or she became licensed.
 - to ensure that foreign graduates who have taken a course of study consisting of at least 4,000 hours and produces a degree of doctor of chiropractic can seek licensure.
 - o the change in subsection (6) adds language to ensure that foreign graduates who have taken a course of study consisting of at least 4,000 hours and produces a degree of doctor of chiropractic can seek licensure.
- NRS 49.215 was amended to include chiropractic physicians within the definition of "doctor" for purposes of privileging and protecting communications between a chiropractic physician and his or her patient in legal proceedings.
- Directive language requiring that all references to "chiropractor" throughout the NRS and NAC to be changed to

"chiropractic physician," and all references to "chiropractor's assistant" to "chiropractic assistant" throughout the NRS and NAC.

Continuing Education

Chiropractic Physicians

- DMV: Disabled Persons Placards Chiropractic Physicians are authorized to submit the application for their patient to obtain a Disabled Persons Placard.
- Pursuant to NAC 634.435 (3) A licensee who retires, moves to another state, closes his or her practice or changes the status of his or her license from active to inactive shall, within 15 days after the retirement, move, closure or change of status, inform the Board of the location at which the records of his or her patients may be obtained.
- Dry Needling Certification: Please verify that the dry needling certification course allows you to obtain 50 hours of course credit prior to performing dry needling.

CA's that are eligible to take the exam(s), as well as their supervising DC, will receive a reminder letter 30-45 days prior to the exam.
