CHIROPRACTIC PHYSICIAN'S BOARD OF NEVADA

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A meeting of the Chiropractic Physicians' Board was held on Thursday, January 12, 2023 at the Fairfield Inn & Suites Las Vegas Airport South, 355 East Warm Springs Road, Las Vegas, NV 89119 and by zoom conference.

The following Board members were present at roll call:

Nicole Canada, DC, President Morgan Rovetti, DC, Board Member Benjamin S. Lurie, DC, Board Member Christian L. Augustin, Esq., Consumer Member Reza R. Ayazi, Esq., Consumer Member

Also, present were Board Counsel, Louis Ling, Esq. and Executive Director, Julie Strandberg. Xavier Martinez, Vice President was not in attendance.

President, Dr. Canada determined a quorum was present and called the meeting to order.

Dr. Canada led those present in the Pledge of Allegiance. Dr. Rovetti stated the Purpose of the Board.

Dr. James T. Overland Sr., DC, Secretary-Treasurer was present.

Agenda Item 1 Public Interest Comments - No action.

There were no public interest comments.

Agenda Item 2 Approval of agenda – For possible action.

Mr. Augustin moved to approve the agenda. Mr. Ayazi seconded, and the motion passed with all in favor.

Agenda Item 3 Approval of the October 13, 2022 Board Meeting Minutes. - For possible action.

Dr. Overland moved to approve the October 13, 2022 Board meeting minutes. Mr. Ayazi seconded, and the motion passed with all in favor.

Agenda Item 4 Legislative Matters – For possible action.

Dan Musgrove with Strategies 360 was present and shared that there are over 82 bill draft requests that refer to healthcare and eleven of those bills mention boards and commissions. Mr. Musgrove shared reasons why it is important for the board to have a lobbyist/legislative advocate on its behalf, to include, keeping the board aware of bills that have an impact as well as keeping the legislators educated about board business. Mr. Musgrove stated that he has reached out to Assemblywoman Doran who is sponsoring language that is still in BDR status that refers to chiropractic physicians. Mr. Musgrove stated that Senator Edgar Flores is introducing a SJR to amend the constitution dealing with boards and commissions, however the language has not been shared. Mr. Musgrove stated that following last session there has been a lot of talk about creating a "super-board" under Business & Industry, which would move all board positions under one department.

<u>Agenda Item 8</u> - Discussion and potential action regarding the contract regarding legislative and governmental affairs – For possible action.

Dr. Canada confirmed that this will be the third session Mr. Musgrove has advocated for this board. Julie Strandberg asked if the board would like to provide names of other lobbyists or amend the contract with Mr. Musgrove/Strategies 360.

Dr. Lurie moved to extend the contract with Strategies 360 for two years following the current expiration date of June 30, 2023. Mr. Ayazi seconded. The motion passed with Dr. Overland and Dr. Rovetti opposing.

Agenda Item 23 Committee Reports

B. Legislative Committee (Dr. Overland) – For possible action

Dr. Overland stated that he was contacted by Dr. Marcia Tinberg, President of the NCA who has been in communication with Assemblywoman Bea Duran who supports the NCA submitting a bill to allow chiropractic physicians to return players to the field following a head injury or concussion. The NCA presented this bill during the 2021 legislative session, however the Osteopathic Association testified that chiropractic physicians did not have the proper education. Dr. Overland asked if the board would provide their support. Mr. Ling stated that once the language is introduced the board can hold an open meeting and vote on the language.

Agenda Item 1 Public Interest Comments - No action.

Due to an issue with the sound over zoom this item was re-addressed.

Dr. Dunleavy stated that he was in attendance to continue the discussion from the previous board meeting, regarding what a chiropractic assistant is allowed to do or not allowed to do.

Dr. Rovetti confirmed that the intent of the proposed revisions is to avoid allowing CA's work forever without passing the exam. Dr. Rovetti asked that the board consider defining an open-book exam. Dr. Rovetti referred to the NBCE reviewing the exam and indicated that it may be impossible to administer a good test that is going to protect the public since DC's do different things in their practices. Dr. Rovetti referred to the proposed new language regarding following two fails the CA will have to stop working as a CA until they pass the exam, which will be

offered monthly. Dr. Rovetti believes that the board will get some push back from the legislative committee if a CA cannot work until they pass the exam.

<u>Agenda Item 5</u> – PUBLIC HEARING for the adoption of a Regulation to Nevada Administrative Code Chapter 634 – For possible action.

Dr. Canada opened the hearing for public comments. Dr. Dave Rovetti stated that the regulation to allow continuing education for attending a board meeting is a great idea, however asked that the time attended be clarified.

Dr. Canada closed the hearing for public comments and opened for board discussion. Dr. Rovetti stated that the language needs to be clearer with respect to how time at the meeting will be calculated and how the hours would be tracked. Dr. Lurie recommended that a policy be set with respect to how attendance will be kept, certificates be issued, and how time spent at the meeting will be calculated. Dr. Lurie recommended that a licensee that is appearing before the board due to a disciplinary hearing should be excluded from obtaining continuing education credits and believes that this language needs to be included.

Mr. Augustin stated that it may be necessary to provide clarity regarding the number of continuing education hours, by adding "up to" four hours and include that if you are here for disciplinary you are excluded from receiving CE. Mr. Ling stated that he will amend the language and bring it back to the board for review.

<u>Agenda Item 6</u> - Discussion and potential action regarding the Application for DC license for Donna Heckeler, DC – For possible action. (Note: The Board may go into closed session pursuant to NRS 241.030 to consider the character alleged misconduct, or professional competence of Dr. Heckeler)

Dr. Canada welcomed Dr. Donna Heckeler. Mr. Ayazi moved to go into closed session. Dr. Lurie seconded, and the motion passed with all in favor. Dr. Canada confirmed that Dr. Heckeler had not practiced chiropractic since graduation and to date had not taken any continuing education. Dr. Heckeler stated that she had adjusted family, but has not been licensed to practice. Dr. Rovetti asked Dr. Heckeler to expand on adjusting family members. Dr. Heckeler stated that she has adjusted her husband, sister, her sisters children and her parents in her home, but never in an office setting and confirmed that she hasn't generated a bill or kept records. Dr. Canada asked if she felt competent to practice and Dr. Heckeler stated that she has a potential job with the Joint and expects that it will be hands-on and there will always be another DC available to assist. Dr. Canada asked if she had a DC mentor that she worked with and Dr. Heckeler stated that there are several DC's that she graduated with that she has kept in touch with and sees what is going on in their practice and visits with one of her colleagues that is in Las Vegas, but hasn't been in a setting where she is in constant contact with the DC.

There was much discussion around Dr. Heckeler not practicing since she graduated from chiropractic college in 2005. The other concern was that Dr. Heckeler confirmed that she practiced chiropractic without a license.

Dr. Canada made a motion to go back into open session. Dr. Overland seconded, and the motioned passed with all in favor.

Dr. Overland made a motion to table the application, that Dr. Heckeler take the Special Purposes Examination for Chiropractic (SPEC) through the National Board of Chiropractic Examiners and take and pass the Boundary Violations, Professional Standards and Unprofessional Conduct sections of the Ethics and Boundaries Assessment Services (EBAS). Dr. Heckeler shall then return before the board upon completion and passing the exams, at which time the board will

recommend the necessary continuing education courses. Dr. Lurie seconded, and the motion passed with all in favor.

Agenda Item 10 NCA Report - No action

Dr. Marcia Tinberg submitted an NCA update in writing. A copy was provided to each board member to review.

Agenda Item 11 NCC Report – No action

A representative from the NCC was not in attendance to report.

Agenda Item 12 Board Counsel Report – No action

Mr. Ling stated that he had nothing to report.

Agenda Item 9 Discussion and potential action regarding the psychometric analysis of the Board's chiropractor's assistant materials completed by the NBCE. – For possible action

Dr. Bruce Shotts attended by zoom and provided an overview of the exam analysis completed by the NBCE. Dr. Shotts commented that it is abnormal to have a different pass-rate with 75% for the in-person exam and 90% for the on-line, open-book exam. Dr. Shotts indicated that approximately 2/3 of the questions on the existing exam need to be re-written for a couple reasons, one being to eliminate true/false questions and two being the wording. Dr. Overland asked if the NBCE could provide the questions that need to be re-written and Dr. Shotts confirmed that once the NBCE updates the exams the board will have the opportunity to review and provide feedback. Dr. Lurie asked whether the board has the option to pay the NBCE to write the exam questions and turn the exam over to the board, or is this all or nothing, where the NBCE writes the exam and takes it over. Dr. Shotts stated that he will confirm whether that is feasible. Dr. Overland made a motion to table. Dr. Canada seconded, and the motion passed with all in favor.

Agenda Item 14 Discussion and potential action regarding the interpretation of NAC 634.348(2)(f) and what was intended to be authorized as "assisting the supervising licensee with an examination of a patient." – For possible action

Mr. Ling stated that at the board's direction he reviewed the question from the DC and reviewed the law to reach his conclusion by determining that assisting is different than performing. Mr. Ling stated that it appears that clinical judgement processes should be done by the DC and not delegated to the CA. The gathering of routine information, that does not require medical judgement seem to be appropriate duties for the CA. Mr. Ling stated that if the board is not satisfied with his conclusion the board can determine the duties allowed by the CA in terms of examinations. Dr. Lurie stated that it is ultimately the responsibility of the DC to ensure that the CA is properly trained on the exam(s) that they are administering, so the CA's duties should be handled on a case-by-case basis. Dr. Canada asked Dr. Dunleavy if he had any questions and he asked, "What does assisting mean?" Mr. Augustin stated that as he reads Mr. Ling's interpretation, assisting can be more defined as under the supervision and control of the chiropractic physician. Dr. Overland stated that if the CA is properly trained by the DC on the exam that is being performed it should be permissible for the CA to perform the duty.

Dr. Overland announced that with us today is Deputy Attorney General, Ms. Chricy Harris and Board Counsel Mr. Louis Ling. Dr. Overland asked Dr. Taylor if he was prepared to go forward without an attorney present and he indicated that he was. Mr. Ling stated that he spoke with Dr. Taylor moments ago and together, have agreed to admit six exhibits into the record, which were provided to Dr. Taylor, Board members and staff. Mr. Ling identified and explained each of the items that he and Dr. Taylor agreed would be stipulated into the record on this matter.

Mr. Ling stated that the board will find the facts in this case are not being contested by Dr. Taylor, but he will admit to you that he has been using a cosmetic laser and performing PRP for years within an office space that he shares with Jill Oliver, MD.

Dr. Taylor was sworn in by DAG, Chricy Harris. Dr. Overland asked Dr. Taylor if he had any comments. Dr. Taylor proceeded to explain that he does not have a practice, but is performing laser on Glimpse Medical patients. Dr. Taylor explained that he practiced

chiropractic for about 20 years and closed his practice in 2009. Dr. Taylor explained that he uses a class II cold laser that has a beam that goes through a sapphire stone, so the beam does not actually touch the face. Dr. Taylor also explained the process of performing PRP. There was extensive discussion between the board and Dr. Taylor. Dr. Overland recommended that Dr. Taylor pursue obtaining an esthetician's license through the Cosmetology Board to perform cosmetic laser.

Mr. Ling stated that there are four causes of action, first, that Dr. Taylor provided cosmetic-only laser treatment, which is not within the scope of chiropractic, second, pursuant to 634.225(1) a chiropractic physician cannot pierce or sever the skin except for diagnostic purposes or to perform dry needling, third, proper medical records were not kept pursuant to NAC 634.435(1)(e), and fourth, misrepresentation of advertisements, specifically the text provided on the Glimpse Medical website.

Mr. Ling stated that the he and the investigating board member, Dr. Canada recommend that the Board, at a minimum, order that Dr. Taylor reimburse the board for its fees and costs for the investigation in this matter and potentially pay a fine, put his license in an inactive status and require that he appear before the board to reactivate his license.

Mr. Augustin made a motion to find the alleged first cause of action be proven. Mr. Ayazi seconded and the motion passed with all in favor.

Mr. Augustin made a motion to find the alleged second cause of action be proven. Mr. Ayazi seconded and the motion passed with all in favor.

Mr. Augustin made a motion to find the alleged third cause of action be proven. Mr. Ayazi seconded, and the motion passed with the exception of Mr. Augustin who opposed.

Mr. Augustin made a motion to find the alleged fourth cause of action be proven. Mr. Ayazi seconded. Dr. Lurie mentioned that, as stated by Dr. Taylor, he began using the class II laser in 2009 and the board policy to not allow chiropractic physicians to use Class II lasers was not issued until 2013. The motion passed with all in favor.

Dr. Canada recused herself from the four motions above as the investigating board member.

Dr. Lurie made a motion to order that Dr. Taylor's license be put in an inactive status and that he be required to appear before the board to re-activate his license, reimburse the boards fees and costs and pay a fine in the amount of \$5,000 for the four causes of action. Dr. Rovetti seconded, and the motion passed with all in favor. Dr. Canada recused herself as the investigating board member.

A meeting of the Chiropractic Physicians' Board was held on Monday, February 27, 2023 by zoom conference.

The following Board members were present at roll call:

Nicole Canada, DC, President James T. Overland Sr., DC Christian L. Augustin, Esq., Consumer Member Reza R. Ayazi, Esq., Consumer Member

Also, present were Board Counsel, Louis Ling, Esq. and Executive Director, Julie Strandberg. Xavier Martinez, Vice President and Dr. Benjamin Lurie were unable to attend.

President, Dr. Canada determined a quorum was present and called the meeting to order.

Dr. Morgan Rovetti was present.

Agenda Item 1 Public Interest Comments - No action.

Dr. Jason Jaeger commented that AB199 and AB153 contain nomenclature errors with respect to using chiropractor rather than chiropractic physician.

Mr. Paul Klein, lobbyist for the NCA was in attendance and explained that AB199 seeks to allow chiropractic physicians to treat and clear an athlete for play following a concussion and is available for questions.

Agenda Item 2 Approval of agenda – For possible action.

Mr. Augustin moved to approve the agenda. Dr. Overland seconded, and the motion passed with all in favor.

Agenda Item 3 Discussion and possible action regarding all bills relating to or of interest to the Board, including but not limited to, AB153 and AB199.

Dr. Overland provided the history of the NCA's attempts to request that chiropractic physicians be included in the existing language that allows MD's, DO's, Physical Therapists and Athletic Trainers to return athletes to play following a head injury or concussion. Dr. Overland

also shared that there are approximately eleven states that regulate and allow chiropractic physicians to return players to the field. There was discussion with respect to what requirements a chiropractic physician would need to qualify to be allowed to return players to the field. Mr. Ling clarified that the qualifications required by a chiropractic physician to be allowed to return players to the field is not included in AB199, but may require discussion following the passing of this bill. Dr. Jaeger stated that some form of training should occur from a public safety standpoint. Dr. Roger Russell stated that chiropractic physicians should not be required to obtain more education than other providers, however concussion protocol changed effective 2017, so it is very important that there be some training to confirm that the DC is competent in treating the head injury or concussion.

Mr. Ayazi made a motion to support AB199. Dr. Overland seconded, and the motion passed with all in favor.

Mr. Ling stated that he brought AB153 before the board to ensure that the definitions of naprapathy do not overlap with the practice of chiropractic. Mr. Ling recommended that the bill not be opposed by the Board, but seek clarification with respect to what is meant by the manipulation of connective tissue and treatment. Dr. Overland stated that he and Mr. Musgrove were on a conference call with the lobbyist and the President of the New Mexico Naprapathy school, which is the only accredited Naprapathy school. New Mexico is also the only state who licenses Naprapathy. Dr. Overland stated that AB153 establishes the Naprapathy advisory board under the Osteopathic Board, however to date the Osteopathic Board has not given approval.

Mr. Ayazi made a motion to remain neutral with concerns. Dr. Rovetti seconded, and the motion passed with all in favor.

Agenda Item 4 Public Interest Comments - No action.

Dr. Dave Rovetti stated that AB153 be revised to include that Naprapths are not allowed to perform a chiropractic adjustment, but a thrust manipulation to the spine or any other joint in the body. Dr. Rovetti referenced the boards meeting regarding executive order 2023-004. Dr. Rovetti iterated that the Governor asked that if not more than fifteen states regulate a certain license that it be eliminated, however there is no mention about eliminating the chiropractic assistant program and be believes it should be eliminated.

Mr. Klein thanked the board for its thoughtful discussion.

Agenda Item 5 Adjournment – For possible action.

Dr. Overland moved to adjourn the meeting. Mr. Augustin seconded, and the motion passed unanimously.

A public hearing to consider potential amendments and removal of various provisions of Nevada Administrative Code (NAC) 634 pursuant to Executive Order 2023-003 issued by Governor Lombardo on January 12, 2023. of the Chiropractic Physicians' Board was held on Friday, March 10, 2023

Also, present were Board Counsel, Louis Ling, Esq. and Executive Director, Julie Strandberg. Dr. James T. Overland Sr., DC, Christian Augustin and Reza Ayazi were not in attendance.

President, Dr. Canada determined a quorum was present and called the meeting to order.

Dr. Canada set the intention of the public hearing and called for public comments.

Dr. Dave Rovetti stated that he is in agreement with the revisions to the advertisement regulations with the exception of the regulation that references the advertisement for a certain fee for services. Dr. Rovetti stated that the advertised price that is charged to the patient must also be charged to the insurer. Dr. Rovetti referenced his comments submitted to the Board with regard to the Governor's direction of omitting an occupation or profession if licensure requirements are not in 26 or more states and since there are only 15 states that regulate chiropractic assistants he indicated that the chiropractic assistant program is an unnecessary regulation.

Dr. Canada closed the public comment portion of the hearing and opened the hearing for discussion from the Board.

Dr. Lurie stated that he has reviewed the amount of time this board has spent discussing the CA program over the last eight years and feels that the board should look at revising the CA program. Dr. Lurie recommended that chiropractic assistants register and take a version of an examination.

Dr. Martinez stated that he feels that the chiropractic physicians' program is overly burdensome since the chiropractic physician is responsible for staff.

Dr. Rovetti recommended that the regulation include that a chiropractic physician be required to maintain malpractice insurance if they employ chiropractic assistants.

Dr. Canada referred to the comments submitted from the NCA, which mentioned CA's performing duties without the chiropractic physician being on-sight. Dr. Canada stated that she is opposed to this. Dr. Martinez agreed.

Dr. Canada stated that with public comments received and the Board's discussion and deliberation, this hearing is now adjourned.

SPECIALTY ADVERTISING

SPECIALTY ADVERTISING [NAC 634.111 and NAC 634.550]

There are two types of specialty advertising approved by the Board:

Diplomate Status: The Board has approved the following specialty fields for diplomate status which may be used in any advertisement. These specialty fields are first approved by a national board governing that specialty which is sponsored by the American Chiropractic Association or the International Chiropractor's Association. Currently, the approved fields are:

- 1. Diagnosis and Internal Disorders
- 2. Diagnostic Imaging
- 3. Neurology
- 4. Nutrition
- 5.Occupational Health
- 6.Chiropractic Orthopedics (DABCO) or International Academy of Neuromusculoskeletal Medicine (IANM)
- 7.Pediatrics
- 8. Sports Physician
- 9. Chiropractic Rehabilitation
- 10. Addictionology and Compulsive Disorders

Certification Status: Chiropractors may advertise a specialty certification if that specialty training has been approved by the Board. The Chiropractor should first submit proof that he has achieved certification status from course work or seminars given by an accredited licensing Board. The proof of certification should include which accredited licensing board approved the training, and the detail of the coursework. Certification in a field of chiropractic warranting advertising must be, at a minimum, a 100-hour course and include an examination to obtain certification. Currently, the approved certifications are:

- 1. Sports Physician
- 2. Chiropractic Rehabilitation
- 3. Certified Forensic Chiropractic Examiners
- 4. Certified Independent Forensic Chiropractic Medical Examiner
- 5. Certified Independent Chiropractic Examiner (CICE) &/or Independent Designated Rater; Certified Independent Rating Specialist (CIRS)
- 6. Certified in Chiropractic Spinal Trauma
- 7. Addictionology and Compulsive Disorders
- 8. Certified Chiropractic Extremity Practitioner
- 9. Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration Certified Medical Examiner
- 10. Certified Functional Medicine Practitioner
- 11. Advanced Certified BioPhysics*

- 12. Dry Needling (NAC 634.3668 50 hours of didactic education)
- (*) Licensees who have completed the Advanced Certified BioPhysics course and test may advertise that they are *certified in Chiropractic BioPhysics*, but the word "Advanced" may <u>not</u> be included in the advertising.

Any licensee who wishes to add to or edit the above approved specialties or certifications may do so upon written request to the Board accompanied by the course material and justification to support the request pursuant to NAC 634.550.

No initials designating certifications, specialties, CE courses attended, etc., other than those listed above may be used for advertising purposes. *See* NAC 634.111 and NAC 634.550, which provide:

NAC 634.111 Advertisement" defined. "Advertisement" includes, without limitation, calling cards, inside and outside signs, stationery, listings in telephone and other directories, and advertisements in newspapers, magazines and by electronic means, including, without limitation, advertisements placed on the Internet.

NAC 634.550 Advertisement as expert or specialist. Except as otherwise provided in NAC 634.515 to 634.570, inclusive, a licensee shall not hold himself out in any advertisement as being:

- 1. Certified; or
- 2. An expert or specialist other than an expert witness,

in a field of chiropractic unless he is registered with and approved by the Board as holding the applicable professional credentials in that field.

In accordance with NAC 634.550 Advertisement as expert or specialist. I am requesting the Chiropractic Board's approval to advertise myself as an "expert or specialist" in chiropractic in the speciality of **Pediatric and Perinatal care**. I Currently have a pediatric certification, perinatal certification and a Webster Certification.

The Pediatric certification is a 200 hour certification (Certification by the Academy Council of Chiropractic Pediatrics: CACCP) and the Perinatal Certification is a 72 hour certification. In response to the email dated August 19, 2022 from Brett Canady, set forth below is my supplemental response to questions 17 and 18 on my application for licensure with the Chiropractic Physicians' Board of Nevada.

In 1994, I was residing in Marietta, Georgia. One night I was out to dinner with friends. The person who was supposed to give me a ride home had too much to drink and was therefore unable to operate a motor vehicle. Although I had consumed one or two alcoholic beverages that evening, I had done so early in the night, and I also had a full meal. We were at the restaurant for over two hours. I was not intoxicated and I reasonably believed that I was fully capable of safely driving a motor vehicle.

While on the ride home, I was pulled over by the police. According to the police officer, I had encroached too far into an oncoming lane of traffic after having completed a right turn. I disclosed to the police officer that I had consumed alcoholic beverages several hours earlier in the evening. I passed all sobriety tests that the police administered that night.

It was my recollection and understanding that, as I had passed the sobriety tests, I was not cited for DUI, but rather a traffic offense.

On my license application, I answered "no" to questions 17 and 18 based upon my good faith belief that I had been arrested and/or charged with a traffic violation and that I had subsequently pled guilty to a traffic violation, and not driving under the influence.

This incident occurred nearly thirty years ago and I do not possess any documents regarding the matter.

Due to the age of the 1994 incident, I am unable to obtain a copy of the court's disposition. In response to my request to obtain a copy of the disposition, I received the attached notice dated November 21, 2022 from the Marietta Municipal Court which states that there are no charges currently pending or disposed of in Marietta Municipal Court. The Court's response also states that the Georgia Court Records Retention Schedule requires courts to retain files related to traffic and other local ordinance violations for six years and for twenty years for the offense of driving under the influence. The Court then destroys those records after the expiration of such time periods. Since the incident occurred in 1994, the Marietta Municipal Court no longer has the records on this matter.

In answering "no" to questions 17 and 18, I did not intend to mislead the Board. I based my application on my personal recollection of the 1994 incident and the resolution of the subsequent court proceeding. It was my good faith belief that I had not been charged with DUI but just a traffic violation, and that therefore my answers were truthful.

I have been a licensed chiropractor in Massachusetts since 1996. I opened my chiropractic clinic in 1996 in Boston, Massachusetts. I have a clean and impeccable record. I have never received a complaint, grievance or claim against me related to my chiropractic practice.

I continue to practice and am contributing in an important and positive way to the community of greater Boston. On April 8, 2022, the Board of Registration of Chiropractors in Massachusetts chose me to handle the monitoring of a chiropractor's re-licensing following a suspension. As a monitor, I am assisting this chiropractor in bringing her practice into compliance with the rules and regulations expected of a licensed chiropractor in Massachusetts.

I am confident that I would make an excellent addition to the Nevada DC community.

I respectfully submit that I have the requisite character and fitness for a license to practice chiropractic medicine in the State of Nevada.

I am prepared to meet with the Board and to provide any further information it may request or answer any questions it may have.

Hello Julie,

This is my formal request to contest the fine levied against me for not filing my self-inspection form in a timely manner. I really appreciate you emailing me to make me aware of this oversight since the written correspondence was returned as undeliverable. I've completed the form in the best way possible considering many of the questions aren't applicable to my current situation. Below I'll list some bullet points as to my concerns, my confusion regarding the form, and why I respectfully ask that a non-financial citation be imposed for this infraction.

- The new process of filling the form out online isn't intuitive in my humble opinion. When we complete the process for our license renewal I request that in the future there is a prompt indicating that you're not finished yet or some other way of linking the two processes together. Instead you receive confirmation that the requirements of your license renewal have been fulfilled. I won't likely make this mistake again but I could see how someone doing their license renewal for the first time could conceivably make the same mistake that I did.
- There is no date that I can find anywhere on the CPBN website indicating when the self-inspection form is due. I also could not find anything stating that it's a requirement connected to our license or that it's a fineable offense to not complete or not complete by a certain date.
- The form seems as if it doesn't apply to me in my specific situation. My license is active, yet the day I completed my license renewal the office I was employed at closed permanently. As I filled the form out I had to answer questions in a non-sensical manner. "Does Not Apply" was used for all questions that didn't have a mandatory drop down option and those with that option had to be answered in ways that don't apply to me just to complete the form. In my mistaken thought process I didn't understand how the form applied to me or how it could garner any useful information so I wrongly assumed that it didn't apply.
- Again, I really appreciate you guys reaching out to me on February 24th to make me aware that I made a
 mistake but I wonder if there wasn't a way that was possible at some point in December prior to this being
 considered late. I understand that could've been a large undertaking if this occurred with multiple people, and
 tedious in general, but considering it's a new process that may have been helpful. Since I submitted my other
 licensure requirements on December 2nd that left nearly a month to recognize my mistake and potentially make
 me aware prior to a formal citation.
- Finally, I've always been in good standing with the board and as you can see I didn't wait until the last minute to submit my ceu's or license renewal application so this obviously wasn't willful disregard of an obligation. I'm also currently unemployed, as stated above that's why the form seemed like it wasn't applicable to my current situation, and \$150 which is 50% of the yearly license cost seems a bit strong considering we've implemented a new process.
- For these reasons | kindly ask for some grace and that myself and any others who regrettably made the same mistake aren't penalized financially for this oversight.

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





2022 DC LICENSE RENEWAL – HOW TO RENEW

THE LICENSE RENEWAL PROCESS HAS CHANGED BEGINNING 2022

The 2022 license renewal period is now available. To keep your license in active or inactive status you must complete the renewal process by 11:59 p.m. PST, December 31, 2022. Once your license is renewed, your license is valid from January 1, 2023 through December 31, 2024.

Licensees will receive a renewal/self-inspection reminder notification by mail and email. To renew a chiropractic physician's license, please login by visiting the Board's website at chirobd.nv.gov and selecting the Licensee Portal. In order to utilize the Licensee Portal, hicensees must create their log in using the email on record_with the board.
Please note that the Self-Inspection process is available through your licensee portal. If you are unable to log-in please contact the Board for assistance by emailing cpbn@chirobd.nv.gov or chirobd.nv.gov or by calling 775-688-1921.

Please note: At its April 14, 2022 meeting the Board approved a one-time reduction to the active renewal fee.

NOTIFY THE BOARD IN WRITING WITHIN 15 DAYS:

Please update through the licensee portal:

- Registration and change of name or Internet address of practice NAC 634.373

 A licensee who operates or organizes a business, corporation, office, partnership for the purpose of providing chiropractic services shall:
 - 1. Ensure that the name of the business, corporation, office, partnership or practice is registered with the Board;
 - 2. If the name of the business, corporation, office, partnership or practice changes, provide the new name to the Board within 15 days after the change; and
 - 3. If the business, corporation, office, partnership of practice maintains one or more websites, provide the Internet address of the website to the Board within 15 days after the establishment or change of the Internet address of one or more of its websites.
- Legal name change NAC 634.375

 A licensee or holder of a certificate who legally changes his or her name from that which is currently registered with the Board or which appears on his or her license or certificate:

1. Shall, within 15 days after the change, provide the Board with the new name by submitting a written statement and legal documentation of the change to the office of the Board.

• Inform the Board of address or changes in location of each practice or principal residence NRS 634.129

- 1. Each chiropractic physician or chiropractor's assistant licensed by the Board shall:
- (a) File with the Board the address of each office where he or she practices; and
- (b) Notify the Board, in writing, of a change in the location of any of those offices within 15 days after the change.
- 2. If the licensee does not have an office for his or her practice, the licensee shall provide the Board with the address of his or her principal residence.

• Legal Residence NAC 634.380

Notify the Board, of any change in his or her legal residence within 15 days after the change.

• Mobile Chiropractic Office NAC 634.383

A chiropractic physician or chiropractic assistant shall notify the Board with 15 days after beginning to practice a mobile chiropractic office.

• Reports of certain judgements, settlements & convictions NAC 634.425

If a judgment is entered against him or her in any court, or a settlement is reached, on a claim involving malpractice, a licensee shall report that fact to the Board within 15 days. The licensee may satisfy the provisions of this subsection if he or she provides the Board with a copy of the judgment or settlement.

2. If a licensee or holder of a certificate is convicted of any crime, other than a traffic violation, he or she shall report that fact to the Board within 15 days after the conviction.

• Health care records NAC 634.425

- 2. A licensee who obtains the records of a patient of another licensee because of a change in the ownership of a practice shall:
- (a) Report to the Board the transfer of the records; and
- (b) Inform the Board, in writing, of the physical location of those records within 15 days after the change in ownership of the practice.
- 3. A licensee who retires, moves to another state, closes his or her practice or changes the status of his or her license from active to inactive shall, within 15 days after the retirement, move,

closure or change of status, inform the Board of the location at which the records of his or her patients may be obtained.

Chiropractic Assistants

• Chiropractic Assistant Application NAC 634.366

An applicant for a certificate as a chiropractic assistant must file an application within 15 days after the date on which they began performing duties as a CA. A licensee shall report to the Board any other license, certificate or registration as a provider of health care.

 A supervising licensee shall notify the Board in writing of any dismissal of a Chiropractic assistant for cause within 10 days after the dismissal. NAC 634.3475

CONTINUING EDUCATION RANDOM AUDIT

Following the renewal period (December 31), a query will run to randomly select 20% of the active licensed chiropractic physicians and active certified chiropractic assistants. A postcard/notice will be sent to the mailing address on record and to the email address on record for each of the selected licensees and certificate holders.

The continuing education certificates may be provided to the Board by uploading the document(s) through the licensee portal found by going to the Boards website (chirobd.nv.gov), by email, fax or mail.

If the licensee fails to provide his or her continuing education certificates within 30 days of the receipt of the random audit notification, an administrative citation will be issued to a chiropractic physician to include a fine in the amount of \$100.00/unit for the licensee's deficient credits, not to exceed \$1,500.00, and are required to complete the number of deficient continuing education credits within 30 days.

If the certificate holder fails to provide his or her CE certificates within 30 days of the receipt of the random audit notification, an administrative citation will be issued to a chiropractic assistant to include a fine in the amount of \$50.00/unit for the person's deficient credits not to exceed \$500.00 and are required to complete the number of deficient continuing education credits within 30 days.

If the licensee or certificate holder fails to comply with the citation, a Notice of Charges will be issued and disciplinary action will be taken.

A licensee is required to complete 36 hours of continuing education by December 31 of every even year. A chiropractic assistant is required to complete 12 hours of continuing education by December 31 of every odd year. The renewal process requires the licensee and the chiropractic assistant to attest to completing the requisite amount of continuing education hours.

Administrative discipline is reportable to CIN-BAD through FCLB. Disciplinary action is reportable the National Practitioners Databank.

Important Dates for Chiropractic Physicians'

Annual Self Inspection January 1 through March 31 of each year.

<u>Biennial Self-Inspection</u>: The submittal of the self-inspection has been aligned with the DC license renewal, October 1 through December 31 of each even year. (Please see the revised language on page 2 under Board Regulation News – NAC 634.384)

Biennial Renewal: October 1, 2022 through December 31, 2022

Business Entities: Initial Registration by January 1, 2022

Renew by May 31 of each year

BOARD REGULATION NEWS

• Effective <u>December 21, 2021</u> the Legislative Commission approved the Boards Regulation R179-20, which includes the following revisions:

In accordance with NRS 622.530 the Board will issue License by Endorsement.

- (a) Holds a corresponding valid and unrestricted license to engage in the practice of chiropractic in the District of Columbia or any state or territory of the United States;
- (b) Possesses qualifications that are substantially similar to the qualifications required for issuance of a license to engage in the practice of chiropractic in this State;
- (c) Has successfully completed parts I, II, III and IV of the examination administered by the National Board of Chiropractic Examiners, or its successor organization, or those parts of the examination in effect at the time that the applicant obtained his or her initial licensure to engage in the practice of chiropractic in the District of Columbia or any state or territory of the United States;
- (d) Has actively engaged in the practice of chiropractic in another state for not less than 7 of the 10 years immediately preceding the date of submission of the application;
- (e) Provides an affidavit stating that the information contained in the application and any accompanying material is true and complete
- (f) Completes the application for endorsement provided by the Board; and (g) Pays the fees prescribed by NAC 634.200 for an application for a license to practice chiropractic and the issuance of such a license.
- 2. The Board will not issue a license by endorsement to engage in the practice of chiropractic in this State if:
- (a) The Board is prohibited from issuing the license by subsection 2 of NRS 622.530; or
 - (b) The report from the Federal Bureau of

Investigation pursuant to paragraph (g) of subsection 2 of NRS 622.530 indicates that the applicant has been convicted of a crime described in subsection 3 of NRS 634.140 and the Board has not previously taken disciplinary action against the licensee based on that conviction.

3. A license by endorsement to engage in the practice of chiropractic issued pursuant to this section may be issued at a meeting of the Board or between meetings of the Board by the President and Executive Director of the Board. Such an issuance is deemed to be an action of the Board.

• NAC 634.355 (2) (a) Satisfies one of the following: (1) [Is certified as a chiropractor's assistant by a] Has successfully completed an educational program [for chiropractor's assistants] offered by a high school, community college, state university or private post-secondary school that is approved by the Board; or (2) Has had 6 months of full-time, or 12 months of parttime, training and employment as a chiropractor's assistant trainee from a licensee.

Self-Inspection

• Sec. 4. NAC 634.384 is hereby amended to read as follows: 634.384 Each licensee shall [annually] biennially submit a self-inspection form prescribed by the Board. The self-inspection form must be received by the Board [between January 1-and March 31.] on or before December 31 of each even-numbered year. The Board will reject a self-inspection form submitted pursuant to this section if the form is incomplete. This revision aligns the self-inspection with the DC renewal.

DISCIPLINARY ACTION

Pursuant to NAC 634.384, each licensed chiropractic physician must submit annually a self-inspection form to the Board's office between January 1 and March 31.

The Board served by certified mail a Citation to the chiropractic physicians, which offered the chiropractic physician two options (1) to pay a fine of \$150.00 and provide the self-inspection form within 30 days of the Citation, or (2) to appeal the Citation to the Board. The chiropractic physicians listed below did not communicate either way.

At its October 28, 2021 meeting, the Board approved a Settlement Agreement & Order with the following chiropractic physicians who were found in violation of NAC 634.384 and for failure to timely respond to the Citation. The chiropractic physicians agreed to submit their 2021 self-inspection, pay a fine of \$150.00 and pay fees and costs associated with the investigation and prosecution in the amount of \$100.00.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION: Dr. Robinson was granted a Nevada license on September 14, 2007 under the condition that he comply with all the terms and conditions of his Agreement on Conditions for Licensure with California and monitoring of his practice by Board-appointed Compliance Monitor. Dr. Robinson's 5-year probation with California commenced on February 14, 2006. He was required to reimburse the California Board's costs of \$3,103.75 and serve 4 hours per month of community service for 2-1/2 years of his probation. It was subsequently determined that Dr. Robinson did not comply with the terms and conditions of his agreement with California, which was addressed at the June 4, 2011 meeting and a new Agreed Settlement was approved by this Board to extend his probation for another five years concurrent with and under the same terms and conditions as his settlement agreement with California.

Pursuant to the attached California Board order Dr. Robinson voluntarily surrendered his license effective June 26, 2021. Confirmation was received from the California Board that Dr. Robinson satisfied the terms his California Order with the exception of receiving a passing score on the California law exam.

3. On or about March 17, 2000, the Board issued Chiropractor License No. DC 26803 to Casey Dean Robinson (Respondent). The Chiropractor License is in cancelled status as of January 3, 2021, and has not been renewed or restored.

JURISDICTION

4. In a disciplinary action entitled "In the Matter of Accusation Against Casey Robinson," Case No. 2004-407, the Board of Chiropractic Examiners, issued a decision, effective April 22, 2006, in which Respondent's Chiropractor License was revoked. However, the revocation was stayed and Respondent was placed on probation for a period of five (5) years. Effective May 4, 2011, following a hearing on a Petition to Revoke Probation, the Board extended Respondent's probation for an additional five (5) years. Due to the tolling of this probation period, however, Respondent currently remains on probation. Under Respondent's probation terms and conditions, condition 15 entitles Respondent to voluntarily surrender his license to the Board. Respondent hereby wishes to exercise this option.

ADVISEMENT AND WAIVERS

- 5. Respondent has carefully read, and understands the terms of his probation in Case No. 2004-407. Respondent also has carefully read, and understands the effects of this Stipulated Surrender of License and Order.
- 6. Respondent voluntarily, knowingly, and intelligently exercises clause 15, "License Surrender," of his probation terms for conditions.
- Respondent understands that by signing this stipulation, he enables the Board to issue an order accepting the surrender of his Chiropractor License without further process.

CONTINGENCY

8. This stipulation shall be subject to approval by the Board. Respondent understands and agrees that counsel for Complainant and the staff of the Board may communicate directly with the Board regarding this stipulation and surrender, without notice to or participation by Respondent. By signing the stipulation, Respondent understands and agrees that he may not withdraw his agreement or seek to rescind the stipulation prior to the time the Board considers and acts upon it. If the Board fails to adopt this stipulation as its Decision and Order, the

Stipulated Surrender and Disciplinary Order shall be of no force or effect, except for this paragraph, it shall be inadmissible in any legal action between the parties, and the Board shall not be disqualified from further action by having considered this matter.

- 9. The parties understand and agree that Portable Document Format (PDF) and facsimile copies of this Stipulated Surrender of License and Order, including PDF and facsimile signatures thereto, shall have the same force and effect as the originals.

ORDER

- 1. The surrender of Respondent's Chiropractor License and the acceptance of the surrendered license by the Board shall constitute the imposition of discipline against Respondent. The Chiropractic Physicians' Board of Nevada (the Board), by and through its counsel Louis Ling hereby enters into this Settlement Agreement with Casey Robinson, D.C. (License No. B1263). Pursuant to chapter 233B and chapter 634 of the Nevada Revised Statutes (NRS) and Nevada Administrative Code (NAC), it is hereby stipulated and agreed, by and between the parties in the above-entitled matter, that this matter shall be settled and resolved upon the following terms:

- 1. Dr. Robinson admits that the facts contained in the Notice of Charges in this matter are true and correct, and Dr. Robinson understands and acknowledges the allegations and charges made in the Notice of Charges. Dr. Robinson further acknowledges that the conduct set out in the Notice of Charges constitutes violations of the Nevada Chiropractic Practice Act (NRS & NAC 634) and that agrees that he is subject to disciplinary action by the Board as a result of that conduct.
- 2. Dr. Robinson is aware of, understands, and has been advised of the effect of this Settlement Agreement, which he has carefully read and fully acknowledged. Dr. Robinson acknowledges that he could have reviewed this Settlement Agreement with legal counsel of his choice and that he chose not to do so.
- 3. Dr. Robinson has freely and voluntarily entered into the Settlement Agreement, and he is aware of his rights to contest the charges pending against him. These rights include representation by an attorney at his own expense, the right to a public hearing on any charges or allegations formally filed, the right to confront and cross-examine witnesses called to testify against him, the right to present evidence on his own behalf, the right to testify on his own behalf, the right to obtain any other type of formal judicial review of this matter, and any other rights which may be accorded to him pursuant the provisions

of Chapters 233B, 622, 622A, and 634 of the NRS and the NAC. Dr. Robinson is voluntarily waiving all these rights in exchange for the Board's acceptance of this Settlement Agreement.

- 4. Should the Settlement Agreement be rejected by the Board, it is agreed that presentation to and consideration by the Board of such proposed Settlement Agreement or other documents or matters pertaining to the consideration of this Settlement Agreement shall not unfairly or illegally prejudice the Board or any of its members from further participation, consideration, adjudication, or resolution of these proceedings and that no Board member shall be disqualified or challenged for bias.
- 5. Dr. Robinson acknowledges that the Settlement Agreement shall only become effective after both the Board and he have duly executed it.

THE PARTIES DO HEREBY AGREE as a result of the admissions and acknowledgements contained in paragraphs 1 through 5 above that the following discipline is fair and appropriate and should be imposed by the Board by way of resolution of this matter:

- 1. Dr. Robinson's chiropractic physician's license (License No. B1263) shall be on probation for a term concurrent with the probation entered by the California Board of Chiropractic Examiners on May 4, 2011 (Case No. 2004-407, hereinafter "the California Order"). A copy of the California Order is attached hereto as Attachment A and is incorporated by this reference. Dr. Robinson shall comply with the terms and conditions of the California Order, and any violation of the California Order shall be deemed a violation of this Settlement Agreement and Order. Throughout the term of probation, Dr. Robinson shall provide to the Board copies of all correspondence, documents, and other materials he provides to or exchanges with the California Board of Chiropractic Examiners related to the California Order. All such copies will be mailed to: Chiropractic Physicians Board of Nevada, 4600 Kietzke Lane, Building M, Suite 245, Reno, Nevada, 89502.
- 2. Dr. Robinson shall meet with the Board or its representatives upon request and shall cooperate with such representatives in their supervision, monitoring, investigation, or auditing to assure compliance with the terms and conditions of this order.
- 3. In the event Dr. Robinson fails to materially comply with any term of this Settlement Agreement, Dr. Robinson agrees his chiropractic license in the State of Nevada shall be automatically

suspended without any action of the Board other than the issuance of an Order of Suspension by the
Executive Director. Upon complying with the term, Dr. Robinson's chiropractic license in the State of
Nevada will be automatically reinstated, assuming all other provisions of the Settlement Agreement are in
compliance. Additionally, Dr. Robinson's failure to comply with any term or condition of this
Settlement Agreement may result in further discipline by the Board, up to and potentially including
revocation of his license. Board Staff may take any and all actions it deems necessary to collect any sums
ordered that remain unpaid. If Board Staff is required to pursue judicial action to effect such collections,
it shall be entitled to recover its attorney's fees and costs incurred in pursuing such judicial action.

PROPOSED DECISION

James Ahler, Administrative Law Judge, Office of Administrative Hearings, State of California, heard this matter on March 10, 2011, in San Diego, California.

Karen L. Gordon, Deputy Attorney General, Department of Justice, State of California, represented Complainant, Robert Puleo, Executive Officer, Board of Chiropractic Examiners, State of California.

Respondent, Casey Robinson, D.C., appeared on his own behalf and was present throughout the administrative hearing.

The matter was submitted on March 10, 2011.

PRELIMINARY STATEMENT

Dr. Robinson violated terms and conditions of probation imposed against his license in April 2006 in that he failed to submit quarterly reports in a timely fashion, failed to pay costs of investigation and prosecution, failed to hire a CPA to monitor his billing practices, and provided only 12 of the 120 hours of community service he was ordered to complete. In this proceeding, Dr. Robinson asserted that his dire financial circumstances and the Board's lack of consideration for his circumstances was the cause of those violations.

Complainant recommended that Dr. Robinson's probation be extended for an additional five years on the same terms and conditions that were previously imposed. Complainant's recommendation forms the basis of the disciplinary order set forth herein.

FACTUAL FINDINGS

Background and License History

- 1. Respondent, Casey Robinson, D.C., was born in December 1968. He grew up in Half Moon Bay, California. He graduated from high school in 1986. Respondent attended Canada Community College and the College of San Mateo. He received an associate's degree in Liberal Arts in 1989. Respondent then attended San Francisco State University, where he received a bachelor's degree in Kinesthesiology in 1992. Respondent then attended the Palmer College of Chiropractic, West Campus, where he received a Doctor of Chiropractic degree in 1999.
- 2. In March 2000, the Board issued Chiropractic License No. DC 26803 to Respondent.

After obtaining licensure, Respondent worked at a friend's chiropractic office in the San Jose area for several months and then moved to San Diego County. After working for approximately one year with Sean Miller, D.C., in the Pacific Beach area, Respondent began working with William Wu, D.C., a chiropractor whose practice was limited to workers' compensation evaluations and treatment. Respondent continued his association with Dr. Wu, and Respondent opened Dr. Wu's satellite office in Fallbrook, where he remained until approximately 2004.

Dr. Wu and Respondent opened a chiropractic office in Illinois in approximately 2005. The practice was not profitable and Respondent returned to California.

3. On a date that was not established, Accusation No. 2004-407 was filed with the Board. Respondent was served with the Accusation and other required jurisdictional documents. Respondent timely filed a notice of defense. On February 14, 2006, Respondent signed a Stipulated Settlement and Disciplinary Order. In that stipulation, Respondent admitted that the allegations set forth in the Accusation were true. Respondent stipulated that his license was subject to discipline, and he agreed to be bound by the Board's imposition of discipline as set forth in the disciplinary order that was contained in the stipulation.

The Board adopted the Stipulated Settlement and Disciplinary Order as its Decision in the matter. On April 22, 2006, the Board's Decision in Case No. 2004-407 became effective. The Board's decision revoked Respondent's license, stayed the revocation, and placed

A letter from Respondent's criminal attorney, Marc X. Carlos, to the Board that was dated November 4. 2009, referenced this matter and acknowledged that Respondent admitted that "On or about October 21, 2003, in the case of People v. Casey Robinson, Superior Court. San Diego County, Case No. 175002, Respondent was convicted by the Court on his plea of no contest to violating Penal Code section 550(b)(1) (conspiring to present a false or fraudulent insurance claim)."

Respondent's license on probation for five years. Terms and conditions of probation required Respondent to file quarterly reports in a timely fashion (condition 3), reimburse the Board \$3,103.75 for its costs of investigation and enforcement (condition 7), retain a Board-approved CPA to monitor Respondent's billing practices at Respondent's expense (condition 18), and complete 120 hours of Board-approved community service (condition 19).

4. At around the time Respondent was placed on probation, his girlfriend (and mother of his son, who was born in 2004) embezzled approximately \$18,000 from Respondent's account. According to Respondent, the girlfriend lost the money gambling at the Barona Casino. He separated from her after finding out about the theft.

Respondent testified that he was broke and homeless by December 2005. He traveled to Sacramento, where he briefly lived with his parents. He returned to San Diego County in May 2006. He lived on friends' couches for many months. He obtained employment as a basketball official, assisted in corporate relocations, and worked as a tour guide. He earned enough money to rent a home in Rancho Penasquitos for a year. He moved to Clairemont in 2007 and lived there for about three years. In 2010, Respondent lived with a new girlfriend in the Talmadge area, but he moved to Pacific Beach when that relationship did not work out.

5. Respondent testified that he earned very little from 2006 to the present. He presented income tax records showing an income of \$13,001 in 2007, \$8,071 in 2008, and \$9,238 in 2009. He estimated he made slightly more in 2010. Respondent said his sources of income included officiating basketball games, corporate relocations, serving as a travel guide, and working off and on as a chiropractor. Respondent testified that he currently works as a chiropractor in Kearny Mesa, where he rents an office from another chiropractor and that he intermittently works as a chiropractor in Las Vegas, where he became licensed a couple of years ago and where he provides services as a qualified medical examiner.

Violations of Probation

6. Quarterly Reports:

- A. Respondent failed to submit a timely probation report covering the period April 1, 2006, through June 30, 2006, which was due on July 10, 2006. Respondent submitted the report on August 28, 2006.
- B. Respondent failed to submit a timely probation report covering the period July 1, 2006, through September 30, 2006, which was due on October 10, 2006. Respondent submitted the report on October 19, 2006.
- C. Respondent failed to submit a timely probation report covering the period October 1, 2006, through December 31, 2006, which was due on January 10, 2007. Respondent submitted the report on January 24, 2007.

- D. Respondent failed to submit a timely probation report covering the period January 1, 2008, through March 31, 2008, which was due on April 10, 2008. Respondent submitted the report on April 21, 2008.
- E. Respondent failed to submit a timely probation report covering the period April 1, 2008, through June 30, 2008, which was due on July 10, 2008. Respondent submitted the report on August 11, 2008.
- F. Respondent failed to submit a timely probation report covering the period October 1, 2008, through December 31, 2008, which was due on January 10, 2009. Respondent submitted the report on September 8, 2009.
- G. Respondent failed to submit a timely probation report covering the period January 1, 2009, through March 31, 2009, which was due on April 10, 2009. Respondent submitted the report on September 8, 2009.
- H. Respondent failed to submit a timely probation report covering the period April 1, 2009, through June 30, 2009, which was due on July 10, 2009. Respondent submitted the report on September 8, 2009.
- I. Respondent failed to submit a timely probation report covering the period October 1, 2009, through December 31, 2009, which was due on January 10, 2010. Respondent submitted the report on January 14, 2010.

Respondent violated condition 3 of probation in that, on nine occasions, he failed to timely file quarterly reports with the Board.

7. <u>Reimbursement of Costs:</u> Respondent was directed to pay the Board \$3,103.75 for its costs of investigation and prosecution. Respondent currently owes \$1,792.75 in costs.

Respondent violated condition 7 of probation in that he failed to make full payment of costs to the Board.

8. <u>Billing Practice Monitoring:</u> Respondent's discipline arouse out of his conviction of billing fraud. The purpose of the monitoring of his billing practices was evident in the conditions of probation which directed the CPA-monitor to report specifically if the CPA found substantial errors or omissions in or questionable billing practices. The condition was designed to protect the public.

Respondent was directed to provide the name of a certified public accountant to the Board for its prior approval and to have a Board-approved certified public accountant submit quarterly written reports to the Board verifying that monitoring of Respondent's billing had taken place. At least four hours per quarter of review were required for the first two monitoring periods. Respondent was responsible for ensuring that the required reports were filed with the Board in a timely fashion.

Respondent submitted the names of two CPAs to the Board for approval. The Board approved them and authorized each CPA to provide billing monitoring services. No CPA's report was filed with the Board because Respondent did not pay the Board-approved CPAs to provide the required services.

Respondent violated condition 18 of probation in that he failed to ensure that required CPA reports were filed quarterly with the Board.

9. <u>Community Service</u>: Respondent was required to submit to the Board for its prior approval a community service program in which he would provide volunteer services for at least four hours per month for the first two and one-half years of probation.

Respondent received Board approval to provide services at the City of San Diego - Pacific Beach Recreation Center. Respondent did not provide proof of any volunteer services there. Respondent submitted documentation establishing that he provided 12 hours of volunteer service at the Ronald McDonald House. Respondent did not provide evidence to the Board of the completion of any other volunteer service.

Respondent violated condition 19 of his probation in that he failed to provide 108 hours of volunteer services.

Evidence in Explanation, Mitigation, and Rehabilitation

10. Respondent asserted that he was not, in fact, convicted of any crime and he implied that he should never have been put on probation. In this regard, Respondent offered court minutes dated October 21, 2006, which stated "defendant is to remain at liberty" and "bail is exonerated" and "proof of compliance is submitted and filed. Case is dismissed." He admitted that as a result of his plea of no contest, he was required to make restitution of at least \$2,500 and possibly as much as \$5,000 to an insurance company, and that his payment of restitution to the insurance company was the reason his case was dismissed. Respondent submitted a letter from his criminal defense attorney that acknowledged that Respondent entered a no contest plea. The letter also stated, in part, "the settlement [of the criminal action] was for a deferred entry of judgment with the contemplation that the case would be dismissed absent a conviction on the completion of community service . . . [The court] did not sentence them on a plea."

With regard to this evidence, it is significant that Respondent specifically acknowledged that the Board had jurisdiction and that there was cause to impose discipline against his license. Respondent stipulated to the terms of the disciplinary order. Respondent's criminal attorney evidently did not consider the fact that the Board is authorized to impose discipline for unprofessional conduct, which includes the conviction of any offense, whether felony or misdemeanor, involving dishonesty. In that regard, the Board was entitled to inquire into the circumstances surrounding the commission and to determine

if the conviction involving dishonesty. By statute, a "plea of nolo contendere is deemed to be a conviction within the meaning of the board's disciplinary provisions. . . ."²

- 11. <u>Quarterly Reports:</u> Respondent admitted that he could have submitted quarterly reports in a timely fashion. He testified that he felt overwhelmed by his personal circumstances and was discouraged by the Board's inflexibility and lack of support.
- 12. <u>Reimbursement of Costs:</u> On August 29, 2006, a Board enforcement analyst advised Respondent that he owed the Board \$3,103.75 in costs, and that he was to make monthly payments in the amount of \$57.00, with those payments due on the first day of each month.

Respondent testified about his financial circumstances as set forth in Factual Findings 4 and 5. Respondent testified that he currently had sufficient funds to pay the Board's costs of investigation and prosecution in full. He did not explain why he had not done so.

According to Complainant, Respondent still owes the Board \$1,792.75 for unpaid costs of investigation and prosecution.

13. <u>Billing Practice Monitoring:</u> Respondent asserted that he was unaware of the reason the Board wanted his billing practice to be monitored. He testified that when he entered into the stipulation, he was unaware that CPAs would charge up to \$300 per hour to provide monitoring services that were required under the disciplinary agreement. He stated that he was unable to afford the CPA-monitoring once he was placed on probation.

On August 23, 2006, a Board enforcement analyst sent a letter to Respondent that advised Respondent that he was in violation of probation for not providing the Board with the name of a CPA for approval. Respondent was directed to submit a name by September 1, 2006. On October 4 and October 26, 2006, a Board enforcement analyst sent another letter to Respondent advising him that he was in violation of his probation for not submitting the name of a CPA to the Board for its approval. On November 14, 2006, CPA Glenn Miller contacted the Board regarding Respondent's reporting requirements. On November 14, 2006, the Board sent a letter to CPA Miller outlining what the Board expected. The Board did not have any further communication with CPA Miller. On January 25, 2007, a Board enforcement analyst sent a letter to Respondent advising him that he was in violation of probation for not submitting the name of a CPA to the Board for its approval.

On March 18, 2008, a Board enforcement analyst advised Respondent that his probation was tolled from December 28, 2006, through September 12, 2007, so that the new ending date for probation was January 6, 2012. The letter advised, among other matters, that Respondent was to retain a CPA to monitor his billing practices and that he was to provide the name of a CPA to the Board for its approval by March 23, 2008.

Title 16, California Code of Regulations, section 317, subdivision (h).

By letter dated July 30, 2008, Respondent advised that CPA Don Wiseman would monitor his billing practice. On August 18, 2008, a Board enforcement analyst sent CPA Wiseman a letter outlining what the Board expected. CPA Wiseman never contacted the Board and did not file a report concerning Respondent's billing practices.

On August 28, 2009, a board compliance analyst sent a letter to Respondent advising him that the Board had approved two CPAs to monitor Respondent's billing practices and to provide quarterly reports about those practices, but no reports were provided. The letter directed Respondent to have CPA Wiseman forward reports for the period form April 22, 2006, to the present. The letter stated that if CPA Wiseman was not available, Respondent was to provide the name of another CPA for Board approval by September 11, 2009.

In his quarterly report dated October 10, 2010, Respondent wrote: "Will you allow me to use a regular accountant instead of a C.P.A. to do quarterly monitoring of my almost non-existent chiropractic business so that I can actually comply with the probation??" Respondent testified that, before October 10, 2010, he asked his probation monitor for permission to use a non-CPA monitor in order to reduce his expenses, but this probation monitor did not respond to his request. There was no evidence to corroborate this testimony.

14. <u>Community Service</u>: Respondent was directed to "submit to the board, for its prior approval, a community service program in which Respondent shall provide volunteer services on a regular basis to a community or charitable facility or agency for at least four (4) hours per month for the first two and one-half (2 ½) years of probation. Such community service does not necessarily include chiropractic service."

Respondent testified that he could have provided all of the volunteer work that was ordered, but he failed to do so. Again, he testified he was overwhelmed by the conditions of probation and was depressed by the lack of support provided by the Board. He testified that he provided 12 hours of volunteer service at the Ronald McDonald House, where his volunteer services had been approved, and that he provided an additional 12 hours of service at the La Jolla Veterans Administration Hospital. Respondent did not discuss the nature of the services he provided at the VA Hospital and he did not give any reason why he did not seek prior approval. He testified that he did not seek credit at the time he provided the volunteer services because he "saw no point to it." Respondent mentioned incidentally that he wants to provide mentoring services to foster youth.

15. Other Matters: Respondent provides child support to the mother of his son by giving her checks in unspecified amounts on an intermittent basis and by deducting \$400 per month from the \$18,000 that the child's mother embezzled years ago. Respondent testified that he found a CPA who will provide billing monitoring services at the rate of \$100 per hour, but he did not submit the name of that CPA to the Board for its approval. Respondent is financially able to pay the Board's full costs of investigation and prosecution at this time.

After the Accusation was served on Respondent and before Respondent signed the stipulated settlement, Respondent hired Charles Benninghoff, a disbarred attorney, to represent him in this matter in Mr. Benninghoff's capacity as a "lay representative". According to Respondent, Mr. Benninghoff took a \$1,500 retainer and promptly disappeared. Respondent thereafter represented himself and signed the stipulation without the benefit of counsel.

Respondent testified that no malpractice action has ever been filed against him, that the cost of his malpractice insurance rose from \$400 per year to \$7,500 per year after he was placed on probation, that being on probation has prevented him from working as a relief chiropractor, that being on probation has prevented him from entering into a chiropractic group practice, that being on probation has prevented him from receiving compensation for professional services from certain insurance carriers, and that the condition of probation that requires him to advise patients of his probationary status has limited his practice.

Respondent testified that he has been able to keep his head above water financially because of his licensure in Nevada approximately two and one-half years ago. Respondent's license in Nevada is on probation as a result of Respondent having been placed on probation in California. Respondent is in full compliance with Nevada's probation.

Respondent testified that when he was unable to pay a CPA to monitor his billing practice, he felt it was pointless to comply with the other terms and conditions of probation and that he let everything fall behind. Respondent testified that he is in a better financial situation now then he was in several years and that he is now ready, willing, and able to comply fully with all terms and conditions of probation that might be imposed following this hearing. Respondent said he looks forward to having the opportunity to demonstrate his ability to comply with terms and conditions of probation.

Disciplinary Arguments

- 16. Complainant noted that the Board's probation unit contacted Respondent many times in an effort to obtain Respondent's compliance with the terms and conditions of probation and made efforts to accommodate Respondent because of his financial circumstances. Complainant recommended that probation be extended for five years.
- 17. Respondent argued that he should not have been placed on probation, that his financial circumstances prevented him from complying with the requirement that his billing practice be monitored, that he permitted other probationary requirements to slide when he could not provide a billing monitor, but that as a result of his recent change in financial circumstance he was ready to complete probation.

Mr. Benninghoff's unsuccessful journey as a "lay representative" is described in *Benninghoff v. Superior Court* (2006) 136 Cal.App.4th 61, which concluded that Mr. Benninghoff's activities as a lay representative in California administrative proceedings involved the unlicensed practice of law.

Evaluation

18. Ordinarily, on this record, the appropriate decision would be to revoke Respondent's probation and impose the discipline that was stayed when probation was granted, i.e., to impose an outright revocation. But Complainant recommended that the probation be extended for five years, and that recommendation is entitled to great weight.

It is determined that it would not be against the public interest to extend Respondent's probation for five years.

Jurisdictional Matters

19. The Petition to Revoke Probation was signed on April 22, 2010, and was served on Respondent. Respondent timely filed a Notice of Defense. On September 28, 2010, Respondent was served with a Notice of Hearing, setting the disciplinary hearing in this matter for March 11, 2011. The Amended Petition to Revoke Probation was filed on March 9, 2011, and it was served on Respondent on March 10, 2011, together with other jurisdictional documents. All new allegations were deemed controverted under Government Code section 11507.

On March 10, 2011, the administrative record was opened and jurisdictional documents were presented. A declaration was admitted under Evidence Code section 11514. Documentary evidence was produced. Sworn testimony was taken. Closing arguments were given; the record was closed; and the matter was submitted.

Costs

20. Complainant did not request reimbursement of costs of investigation and enforcement in this proceeding.

LEGAL CONCLUSIONS

The Standard of Proof

1. While an administrative agency is required to prove the allegations in an accusation by clear and convincing evidence, the agency is required to prove the allegations in a petition to revoke probation only by a preponderance of the evidence. (*Sandarg v. Dental Bd. of California* (2010) 184 Cal.App.4th 1434, 1441.)

Statutory Authority

2. Business and Professions Code section 1000 provides:

The law governing practitioners of chiropractic is found in an initiative act entitled "An act prescribing the terms upon which licenses may be issued to practitioners of chiropractic, creating the State Board of Chiropractic Examiners, and declaring its powers and duties, prescribing penalties for violation hereof, and repealing all acts and parts of acts inconsistent herewith," adopted by the electors November 7, 1922.

3. Business and Professions Code section 1000-4 provides in pertinent part:

The board shall have power:

- (b) To adopt from time to time such rules and regulations as the board may deem proper and necessary for . . . the protection of the public. . . "
- (c) To . . . revoke licenses to practice chiropractic, as herein provided. . . .
- 4. Business and Professions Code section 1000-10⁴ provides in pertinent part:
 - (a) The board may by rule or regulation adopt, amend or repeal rules of professional conduct appropriate to the establishment and maintenance of a high standard of professional service and the protection of the public

Regulatory Authority

5. Title 16, California Code of Regulations, section 317 provides in part:

The board shall take action against any holder of a license who is guilty of unprofessional conduct . . .

Unprofessional conduct includes, but is not limited to, the following:

While the Chiropractic Act is not formally included in the Business and Professions Code, it is set out in *West's Annotated Codes* in the Business and Professions Code section.

- (g) Conviction of a crime which is substantially related to the qualifications, functions or duties of a chiropractor;
- (h) Conviction of any offense, whether felony or misdemeanor, involving moral turpitude, dishonesty, physical violence or corruption. The board may inquire into the circumstances surrounding the commission of the crime in order to fix the degree of discipline or to determine if such conviction was of an offense involving moral turpitude, dishonesty, physical violence or corruption. A . . . plea of nolo contendere is deemed to be a conviction within the meaning of the board's disciplinary provisions . . .
- (k) The commission of any act involving moral turpitude, dishonesty, or corruption, whether the act is committed in the course of the individual's activities as a license holder, or otherwise;
- (q) The participation in any act of fraud or misrepresentation

Other Relevant Authority

6. Respondent cannot require the Board to independently reexamine the facts that underlie his no contest plea. The Board was and is entitled to rely on Respondent's plea to establish the fact of his conviction and whether the offense necessarily involved dishonesty. (*Arneson v. Fox* (1980) 28 Cal. 3d 440, 452.).

Cause Exists to Extend the Period of Probation

7. A preponderance of the evidence established that Respondent violated the terms and conditions of his probation in that Respondent failed to submit quarterly reports in a timely fashion, failed to ensure that quarterly reports from a CPA regarding Respondent's billing practices were submitted to the Board, failed to provide mandated community service, and failed to pay costs of investigation and prosecution. Under the circumstances, it would not be unreasonable to extend Respondent's period of probation for an additional period of five years beyond the effective date of the Board's Decision herein.

ORDER

The Petition to Revoke Probation is granted. Probation is revoked and is reinstated on the same terms and conditions as previously imposed, except that the period of probation shall extend five years beyond the effective date of the Decision in this matter. Respondent shall be given credit for the amount of his payment of costs of investigation and prosecution and for the amount of community service for which he provided proof to the Board. All other terms and conditions of the probation previously imposed shall remain in full force and effect.

Julie,

Thank you for allowing the time for me to talk with your board during their most recent meeting. As I mentioned, most state boards don't generate a lot of income from exams and they refer their testing to us because they don't want to spend the time and effort to maintain these exams. Although these exams are necessary to practice, they aren't considered high-stakes exams simply because they can be taken at any time and as often as needed, so it doesn't create much of a barrier to practice. Since the NBCE has established processes for developing these exams, we can accomplish this in a relatively efficient way, but it still requires some of our resources for every exam that we develop, administer and score. Our board has directed me to offer these exams to the state boards without consideration of many of the peripheral expenses that it takes to run this business simply because it is considered a service to the primary stakeholders that we serve. This is the rationale for why we charge such a small fee to cover development, updating, scoring and the additional steps in the process.

During the meeting, Dr. Lurie requested an estimate on the cost to write items, monitor the progress of the exam and to update the exam as necessary, which I have discussed with NBCE CEO, Dr. Norman Ouzts. Our concern is that if we provide partial services instead of what we are designed to do, then we will no longer be able to be in control of maintaining the quality of the product and we will also consume our resources without fulfilling the directives of our board. Since we utilize all of our subject matter experts in reviews of our exams, as well as the IT department with managing the testing engine and score reporting, and the Psychometric department with the scoring and reporting process, to charge for those services would be close to the same amount as what we charge for the administration of the exams. Additionally, it would be more difficult to organize and we would not be able to carry the responsibility of a legally defensible exam.

We are still offering to develop, administer, and score the exams as we have discussed, but unfortunately, we won't be able to perform only selected portions of the examination process. I understand that your board would like to maintain revenue from these exams, and hopefully they also see the benefits of letting the NBCE manage the exam process.

I notice on your website that the fee to take the DC jurisprudence exam is \$125 and the CA exam is \$75, which is above what we would require to manage the exam process. I would suggest that your board consider allowing us to manage the exams, collect the full fee as listed on your website when the examinee applies to take the test, and then the NBCE could cut a check quarterly to the Nevada board for their portion of the fees. We don't typically offer this option, and we would probably change our exam fee to \$60 in order to compensate for this service, but it would provide revenue to the Nevada board and allow them to get away from the test development process.

Let me know your thoughts after you present this to your board. Hopefully this can be a win-win

solution for everyone involved.

MEMORANDUM

TO: Members of the Chiropractic Physicians' Board of Nevada

FROM: Louis Ling, Board Counsel

DATE: December 21, 2022

RE: NAC 634.430(1)(b) and Issues of Consent in Treating a Minor Patient

At the Board's October 13, 2022 meeting, the Board directed that I research the issue related to NAC 634.430(1)(b) and the duty of a chiropractic physician to obtain consent before providing chiropractic services to a minor. My analysis follows:

ANALYSIS

NAC 634.430(1)(b) defines "conduct unbecoming a person licensed to practice chiropractic or detrimental to the best interests of the public" to include: "(b) Performing any chiropractic service on a patient who is under the age of 18 years without first obtaining the consent of the *parent or legal guardian* of that patient *if the consent is required pursuant to NRS 129.030.*" (Emphasis supplied.) Conduct unbecoming a person licensed to practice chiropractic is subject to discipline under NRS 634.018(10) and NRS 634.140(1) as "unprofessional conduct." Analytically, NAC 634.430(1)(b) raises two practical questions important to chiropractic physicians and their practices.

1. When Can a Minor Consent on His or Her Own?

The first question raised in NAC 634.430(1)(b) is explicit in the regulation, namely when is consent "required pursuant to NRS 129.030"? As might be expected, the answer to such a statutory question is found in the statute itself, but actually in the inverse. The general rule is that a minor cannot consent to receive medical services with the exceptions set out in NRS 129.030(1), which provides a list of four situations in which a minor could consent to treatment himself or herself, as follows:

- 1. Except as otherwise provided in NRS 450B.525, a minor may give consent for an examination or the services provided in subsection 3 for himself or herself or for this or her child, if the minor:
- (a) Demonstrates in accordance with subsection 2 that he or she is living apart from his or her parents or legal guardian, with or without the consent of the parent, parents or legal guardian;
 - (b) Is married or has been married;

- (c) Is a parent or has borne a child; or
- (d) Is, in the judgment of a provider of health care, in danger of suffering a serious health hazard if health care services are not provided.

Pursuant to NRS 129.030(2), a minor can demonstrate that he or she is living apart from his or her parent or legal guardian with a written statement to that effect signed by: (1) a director or a governmental agency or nonprofit organization that provides services to the homeless, (2) a school social worker, a school counselor, or a person designated as a local educational agency liaison for homeless children, or (3) an attorney representing the minor. Pursuant to NRS 129.030(3), the services a qualified minor might consent to are, broadly, any medical services, which would include chiropractic services.

Importantly from a practical standpoint is that in NRS 129.030(4), a medical provider such as a chiropractic physician who wishes to provide services to a minor is obliged to "make prudent and reasonable efforts to obtain the consent of the minor to communicate with his or her parent, parents or legal guardian" and must note such efforts in the medical record. Even where the minor denies consent for the provider to contact the parent or legal guardian, the services may still be provided.

Therefore, as a best practice, if a minor seeks chiropractic services in the absence of a parent or legal guardian, the chiropractic physician must follow two steps. First determine if the minor is eligible to consent to the services by satisfying one of the four situations listed in NRS 129.030(1). Second, if so, and if the chiropractic physician obtains the proper substantiating paperwork (such as a written statement as set out in NRS 129.030(2) or evidence of marriage or parentage), the chiropractic physician then must seek consent from the minor to speak with a parent or legal guardian and should document either the granting of the consent (in which case the chiropractic physician must attempt to contact the parent or legal guardian) or the denial of consent (in which case the chiropractic physician may still provide services after documenting the denial of consent).

2. If NRS 129.030 Does Not Apply, Who May Consent to Treatment of a Minor

In most circumstances, NRS 129.030 will not apply and a chiropractic physician will need to obtain the consent of an adult before treating a minor. The two classes of adults who may give consent are parents and legal guardians.

Regarding the definition of "parent," NRS 126.021(3) defines "Parent and child relationship" as being "the legal relationship existing between a child and his or her natural or adoptive parents incident to which the law confers or imposes rights, privileges, duties and obligations." In other words, a parent is either one of the two natural parents of a child or is one of the two adoptive parents of the child. Practically, if a person represents to a chiropractic physician that he or she is the parent of a minor, absent some reason to doubt the claim (which would be highly unlikely), a chiropractic physician can accept the representation and can act accordingly.

Regarding the definition of "legal guardian," guardianship of a minor encompasses an entire chapter of the NRS, namely NRS ch. 159A. Though there is considerable procedure, process, qualifications, and conditions involved, all guardianship matters

ultimately result in a court ruling that a person not a parent to a minor is the minor's guardian. The end result of guardianship will be a court order – no court order, no guardianship.

Therefore, as a best practice, if a minor is in the presence of a person who represents himself or herself to be the parent of the minor, and there is no reason to doubt the representation, then a chiropractic physician can rely upon the representation and can seek consent to treat the minor from that person. If a minor is in the presence of a person who represents himself or herself to be a legal guardian of the minor, the chiropractic physician should seek from the guardian a copy of the court order imposing the guardianship. If the person is, in fact, a legal guardian, he or she should have a copy of such an order readily available and should not have issues with providing a copy. If the person is not, in fact, a legal guardian or if the person refuses to provide a court order, the chiropractic physician should decline to provide services to the minor.

CONCLUSION

When a chiropractic physician is presented with a minor for treatment, the chiropractic physician may treat the minor under one of two circumstances: (1) the minor can consent to treatment himself or herself if he or she establishes that he or she is entitled to do so under NRS 129.030; or (2) the parent or legal guardian consents to treatment of the minor where the circumstances establish that the adult is either the parent naturally or by adoption or that the adult is a legal guardian of the minor as evidenced by a court order appointing the adult to such guardianship.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION: Please refer to the meeting minutes from the Boards September 26, 2015 meeting below and NRS 640C.060 "Massage Therapy" defined.

Mr. Ling opened that a CA may do massage on an area of a patient's body utilizing a mechanical vibration, impulse devises, or manual pressure and massage work as long as the area of the body being worked on is a focal area of concern for the supervising DC and not a full, general, non-focal, relaxation-type massage.

Mr. Ling reported that he contacted the Executive Director for the Massage Board and for disclosure purposes Mr. Ling stated that he also represents the Massage Board. Mr. Ling spoke to Lisa Cooper, who referenced NRS 640C.100 (1) (a), which states who must be licensed as a massage therapist and who does not. When this statute was created they were very particular about using the word, "licensed," so without a "license" you cannot perform massage therapy. Chiropractic Assistant's performing massage therapy are required to be licensed by the Massage Board.

NRS 640C.060 "Massage therapy" defined.

- 1. "Massage therapy" means the application of a system of pressure to the muscular structure and soft tissues of the human body for therapeutic purposes, including, without limitation:
 - (a) Effleurage;
 - (b) Petrissage;
 - (c) Tapotement;
 - (d) Compressions;
 - (e) Vibration;
 - (f) Friction; and
- (g) Movements applied manually with or without superficial heat, cold, water or lubricants for the purpose of maintaining good health and establishing and maintaining good physical condition.
 - 2. The term does not include:
 - (a) Diagnosis, adjustment, mobilization or manipulation of any articulations of the body or spine; or
- (b) The demonstration of a product on a person that applies a system of pressure to the muscular structure and soft tissues of the human body, provided that the demonstration is not longer than 2 minutes.

Chapter 634 – Chiropractic Physicians and Chiropractic Assistants

NAC 634.348 Performance of ancillary services. (NRS 634.030, 634.125)

- 1. A person who desires to perform ancillary services must obtain a certificate as a chiropractic assistant.
- 2. A person who holds a certificate as a chiropractic assistant may perform ancillary services, including, without limitation:
 - (a) Administering to patients by means of physiotherapeutic equipment;
 - (b) Taking and developing radiographs;
 - (c) Assisting with the education of a patient concerning his or her health;
 - (d) Assisting a patient with exercise or rehabilitation activities;
 - (e) Taking the history of the health of a patient; and
 - (f) Assisting the supervising licensee with an examination of a patient.
- 3. A person who holds a certificate as a chiropractic assistant may take and develop radiographs only after the supervising licensee has:
 - (a) Determined that radiographs are appropriate for the patient; and
 - (b) Ordered the person to take and develop radiographs for the patient.

Chapter 640B – Athletic Trainers (pertinent sections)

NRS 640B.003 Legislative declaration. The practice of athletic training is hereby declared to be a learned profession, affecting public health, safety and welfare, and subject to regulation to protect the public from the practice of athletic training by unqualified persons and from unprofessional conduct by persons who are licensed to engage in the practice of athletic training.

(Added to NRS by 2003, 896)

NRS 640B.005 Definitions. As used in this chapter, unless the context otherwise requires, the words and terms defined in NRS 640B.011 to 640B.120, inclusive, have the meanings ascribed to them in those sections.

NRS 640B.011 "Assessment" defined. "Assessment" includes taking the medical history of a patient, visually inspecting the injured portion of the body and the associated structures, palpating the bony landmarks and soft tissue and applying special tests to systematically assess the pathology and extent of the injury or condition.

(Added to NRS by 2003, 894)

NRS 640B.015 "Athlete" defined. "Athlete" means a natural person who:

- 1. Participates in an athletic activity conducted by:
- (a) An intercollegiate athletic association or interscholastic athletic association;
- (b) A professional athletic organization; or
- (c) An amateur athletic organization; or
- 2. Participates in a recreational sport activity that:
- (a) Has officially designated coaches;

- (b) Conducts regularly scheduled practices or workouts that are supervised by coaches; and
- (c) Has established schedules for competitive events or exhibitions.

(Added to NRS by 2003, 894)

NRS 640B.021 "Athletic injury" defined. "Athletic injury" means an injury or athletic-related illness, or both, that a person sustains as a result of:

- 1. Participation in an athletic activity conducted by:
- (a) An intercollegiate athletic association or interscholastic athletic association;
- (b) A professional athletic organization; or
- (c) An amateur athletic organization; or
- 2. Participation in a recreational sport activity that:
- (a) Has officially designated coaches;
- (b) Conducts regularly scheduled practices or workouts that are supervised by coaches; and
- (c) Has established schedules for competitive events or exhibitions.

(Added to NRS by 2003, 894)

NRS 640B.025 "Board" defined. "Board" means the Board of Athletic Trainers. (Added to NRS by 2003, 894)

NRS 640B.031 "Direction" defined. "Direction" means an order issued by a physician to follow as a protocol, recommendation or oral order that is documented by the licensed athletic trainer or physician, or both.

(Added to NRS by 2003, 894)

NRS 640B.035 "Disposition" defined. "Disposition" means the application of accepted management techniques to provide the appropriate care and resources concerning an athletic injury.

(Added to NRS by 2003, 894)

NRS 640B.037 "Dry needling" defined. "Dry needling":

- 1. Means a skilled technique performed by an athletic trainer using a single-use, single-insertion, sterile filiform needle, which is used to penetrate the skin or underlying tissue to effect change in body conditions, pain, movement, impairment and disability.
 - 2. Does not include:
 - (a) The stimulation of an auricular point;
 - (b) The stimulation of sinus points or other nonlocal points to treat underlying organs;
 - (c) Needle retention; or
 - (d) The teaching or application of acupuncture.

(Added to NRS by 2019, 1587)

NRS 640B.041 "Evaluation" defined. "Evaluation" includes, without limitation, the use of joint range of motion, manual muscle tests, ligamentous stress tests, neurological tests and functional capacity assessments.

(Added to NRS by 2003, 894)

NRS 640B.045 "Grade 5 joint mobilization" defined. "Grade 5 joint mobilization" means the movement of a joint beyond its physiological and capsular end point.

(Added to NRS by 2003, 894)

NRS 640B.051 "Graduate student athletic trainer" defined. "Graduate student athletic trainer" means a graduate student who:

- 1. Is enrolled in a graduate program of study approved by the Board; and
- 2. Engages in the practice of athletic training under the supervision of a licensed athletic trainer.

NRS 640B.055 "Joint mobilization" defined. "Joint mobilization" means a learned, skilled, passive movement of articulating surfaces of a person to relieve pain and restore functional movement of the articulating surfaces without pain to the person. The term does not include:

- 1. The diagnosis of a physical disability;
- 2. The massaging of the superficial soft tissues of the body;
- 3. The use of X-rays or radium;
- 4. The use of electricity for cauterization or surgery;
- 5. Chiropractic adjustment as defined in NRS 634.014; or
- 6. Grade 5 joint mobilization.

(Added to NRS by 2003, 894)

NRS 640B.060 "License" defined. "License" means a license issued pursuant to the provisions of this chapter.

(Added to NRS by 2003, 895)

NRS 640B.065 "Licensee" defined. "Licensee" means a person who has been issued a license as an athletic trainer pursuant to the provisions of this chapter.

(Added to NRS by 2003, 895)

NRS 640B.070 "Management" defined. "Management" means the act of controlling or influencing an injury, illness or condition.

(Added to NRS by 2003, 895)

NRS 640B.075 "Passive joint range of motion" defined. "Passive joint range of motion" means any movement of an articulating surface of a person without the active assistance of that person, which is performed with equipment or by another person.

(Added to NRS by 2003, 895)

NRS 640B.081 "Passive range of motion" defined. "Passive range of motion" means any movement of a part of a person without the active assistance of that person, which is performed with equipment or by another person.

(Added to NRS by 2003, 895)

NRS 640B.085 "Physician" defined. "Physician" means:

- 1. A physician licensed pursuant to chapter 630 of NRS;
- 2. An osteopathic physician licensed pursuant to chapter 633 of NRS;
- 3. A homeopathic physician licensed pursuant to chapter 630A of NRS;
- 4. A chiropractic physician licensed pursuant to chapter 634 of NRS; or
- 5. A podiatric physician licensed pursuant to chapter 635 of NRS.

(Added to NRS by 2003, 895)

NRS 640B.090 "Practice of athletic training" defined.

- 1. "Practice of athletic training" means:
- (a) The prevention, recognition, assessment, management, treatment, disposition or reconditioning of the athletic injury of an athlete:
- (1) Whose condition is within the professional preparation and education of the licensed athletic trainer; and
 - (2) That is performed under the direction of a physician;
 - (b) The organization and administration of programs of athletic training;
 - (c) The administration of an athletic training room;

- (d) The provision of information relating to athletic training to members of the public;
- (e) The performance of dry needling under the direction of a physician, if an athletic trainer is qualified to do so pursuant to the regulations adopted in accordance with subsection 5 of NRS 640B.260; or
 - (f) Any combination of the activities described in paragraphs (a) to (e), inclusive.
- 2. The term does not include the diagnosis of a physical disability, massaging of the superficial soft tissues of the body or the use of X-rays, radium or electricity for cauterization or surgery.

(Added to NRS by 2003, 895; A 2019, 1588)

NRS 640B.095 "Prevention" defined. "Prevention" means the application and implementation of physical conditioning programs, preparticipation screening and the monitoring of risk factors that may cause an athletic injury.

(Added to NRS by 2003, 895)

NRS 640B.101 "Recognition" defined. "Recognition" means the application of visual, verbal or tactile skills to acknowledge the presence of an injury, illness or other condition with an understanding of the predisposing factors of injury and pathomechanics, which assists in the assessment of the injury, illness or other condition.

(Added to NRS by 2003, 895)

NRS 640B.105 "Reconditioning" defined. "Reconditioning" means the application of practical and didactic knowledge and functional criteria to evaluate readiness for return to partial or full activities. (Added to NRS by 2003, 895)

NRS 640B.111 "Student athletic trainer" defined. "Student athletic trainer" means an undergraduate student who:

- 1. Is enrolled in an undergraduate program of study approved by the Board; and
- 2. Engages in the practice of athletic training under the supervision of a licensed athletic trainer. (Added to NRS by 2003, 896)

NRS 640B.115 "Supervision" defined. "Supervision" means clinical on-site direction given by a licensed athletic trainer to a student athletic trainer or graduate student athletic trainer who is in the direct line of sight and within hearing distance of the licensed athletic trainer.

(Added to NRS by 2003, 896)

NRS 640B.120 "Treatment" defined. "Treatment" means the application of the necessary knowledge and skills to assess an injury, illness or other condition and provide appropriate care. (Added to NRS by 2003, 896)

NRS 640B.145 Applicability of chapter. The provisions of this chapter do not apply to:

- 1. A person who is licensed pursuant to <u>chapters 630</u> to <u>637</u>, inclusive, or chapter <u>640</u>, <u>640A</u> or <u>641D</u> of NRS, when acting within the scope of that license.
- 2. A person who is employed by the Federal Government and engages in the practice of athletic training within the scope of that employment.
- 3. A person who is temporarily exempt from licensure pursuant to <u>NRS 640B.335</u> and is practicing athletic training within the scope of the exemption.

(Added to NRS by 2003, 896; A 2017, 3484; 2021, 1600)

NRS 640B.155 License is revocable privilege; holder acquires no vested right. A license issued pursuant to the provisions of this chapter is a revocable privilege, and the holder of the license does not acquire thereby any vested right.

(Added to NRS by 2003, 896)

General Provisions

NRS 640B.300 License required to practice athletic training; certain acts prohibited without license; exception for certain student athletic trainers; injunctive relief.

- 1. Except as otherwise provided in subsection 2, unless he or she has been issued a license as an athletic trainer by the Board pursuant to the provisions of this chapter, a person shall not:
 - (a) Engage in the practice of athletic training;
 - (b) Hold himself or herself out as licensed or qualified to engage in the practice of athletic training; or
- (c) Use in connection with his or her name any title, words, letters or other designation intended to imply or designate him or her as a licensed athletic trainer.
- 2. A student athletic trainer or graduate student athletic trainer may engage in the practice of athletic training while under the supervision of a licensed athletic trainer.
- 3. If the Board determines that a person has engaged, or is about to engage, in any act or practice that constitutes, or will constitute, a violation of the provisions of this section, the Board may make an application to an appropriate court for an order enjoining that act or practice, and upon a showing by the Board that the person has engaged, or is about to engage, in that act or practice, the court shall issue an injunction against that act or practice. Such an injunction does not prevent a criminal prosecution for that act or practice.

(Added to NRS by 2003, 898)

NRS 640B.310 Requirements for license: Qualifications; application; fingerprints; fees; examination; exception; reapplication after failure to pass examination.

- 1. An applicant for a license as an athletic trainer must:
- (a) Be of good moral character;
- (b) Have at least a bachelor's degree in a program of study approved by the Board;
- (c) Submit an application on a form provided by the Board;
- (d) Submit a complete set of fingerprints and written permission authorizing the Board to forward the fingerprints to the Central Repository for Nevada Records of Criminal History for submission to the Federal Bureau of Investigation for its report;
 - (e) Pay the fees prescribed by the Board pursuant to NRS 640B.410, which are not refundable; and
- (f) Except as otherwise provided in subsection 2 and <u>NRS 640B.320</u>, pass the examination prepared by the National Athletic Trainers Association Board of Certification or its successor organization.
- 2. An applicant who submits proof of current certification as an athletic trainer by the National Athletic Trainers Association Board of Certification, or its successor organization, is not required to pass the examination required by paragraph (f) of subsection 1.
- 3. An applicant who fails the examination may not reapply for a license for at least 1 year after the date on which the applicant submitted the application to the Board.

(Added to NRS by 2003, 899; A 2005, 228; 2019, 4300)

Scope of Practice

NRS 640B.370 Educational requirements to conduct evaluation of athletic injury or perform joint mobilization or to perform passive range of motion or passive joint range of motion.

- 1. A person who is licensed as an athletic trainer shall not conduct an evaluation of an athletic injury or perform joint mobilization unless the person has earned at least a master's degree in athletic training or a comparable area of study, as determined by the Board.
- 2. A person who is licensed as an athletic trainer and has not earned a master's degree in athletic training or a comparable area of study, as determined by the Board, may perform passive range of motion or passive joint range of motion.

CHIROPRACTIC ASSISTANTS

Propose Amendments to the Nevada Administrative Code

NAC 634.305 Examination for certification as Chiropractic assistant; passing score; failure to pass; failure to appear. (NRS 634.030)

- 1. At least once each year, the Board will administer an examination to applicants for a certificate as a Chiropractic assistant.
- 2. The examination will consist of the following subjects, including, without limitation:
- (a) Radiographic technology, protection, quality control and positioning of the patient;
 - (b) Ancillary procedures and applications relating to chiropractic; and
 - (c) The provisions of NRS and NAC that are related to the practice of chiropractic.
- 3. An applicant who receives a score of at least 75 percent for a closed-book examination or a score of at least [90] 75 percent for an open-book examination is entitled to a certificate as a Chiropractic assistant.
- 4. If an applicant fails to receive a score of at least 75 percent for a closed-book examination or a score of at least [90] 75 percent for an open-book examination the first time he or she takes the examination, the applicant may retake the examination [within 1 year] the next scheduled exam without payment of an additional fee.
- 5. If an applicant who receives training and employment as a Chiropractic assistant trainee pursuant to subparagraph (2) of paragraph (a) of subsection 2 of NAC 634.355 fails to receive a score of at least 75 percent for a closed-book examination or a score of at least [90] 75 percent for an open-book examination after two attempts [and wishes to continue working as a Chiropractic assistant trainee, the supervising licensee must, within 30 days after the date of the notice from the Board of the results of the examination, submit a plan for additional training to the Board. The chair of the test committee will:
- (a) Approve or deny the plan; and
- (b) Determine whether the Chiropractic assistant trainee may continue working as a Chiropractic assistant trainee.
- 6. If, pursuant to paragraph (b) of subsection 5, the chair of the test committee determines that a Chiropractic assistant trainee may continue working as a Chiropractic assistant trainee, the Chiropractic assistant trainee may continue working as a Chiropractic assistant trainee if he or she:
- (a) Pursuant to NAC 634.350, submits a new application for a certificate as a Chiropractic assistant and pays the required fee; and
- (b) Provides the chair of the test committee with proof that the Chiropractic assistant trainee is enrolled in an educational course in a subject described in subsection 2.
- 7. If a Chiropractic assistant trainee who has submitted an application pursuant to paragraph (a) of subsection 6 fails to receive a score of at least 75 percent for a closed-book examination or a score of at least 90 percent for an open-book examination after two attempts, the Chiropractic assistant trainee shall not work as a Chiropractic

assistant trainee until the Chiropractic assistant trainee has received a score of at least 75 percent for a closed-book examination or a score of at least [90] 75 percent for an open-book examination.

- 8. An applicant for a certificate as a Chiropractic assistant who fails [on two occasions] *twice* to appear for an examination that he or she has been scheduled to take:
 - (a) Shall be deemed to have withdrawn his or her application;
 - (b) Forfeits any application fees paid to the Board; and
- (c) Must, if he or she has been receiving training and employment as a Chiropractic assistant trainee pursuant to subparagraph (2) of paragraph (a) of subsection 2 of NAC 634.355, cease working as a Chiropractic assistant trainee.
- → If the applicant applies thereafter for a certificate, the applicant must establish eligibility for the certificate in accordance with the provisions of this chapter and chapter 634 of NRS.
- [9. As used in this section, "chair of the test committee" means the member of the Board who is assigned by the Board to serve as the chair of the committee that is created by the Board to administer an examination to applicants for a certificate as a Chiropraetic assistant.]

NAC 634.355 Certification: Additional requirements; waiver of requirements. (NRS 634.030, 634.123)

- 1. An applicant for a certificate as a Chiropractic assistant must, in addition to fulfilling the requirements of NAC 634.350, furnish evidence satisfactory to the Board that he or she:
 - (a) Is 18 years of age or older; and
- (b) Has received a score of at least 75 percent for a closed-book examination or a score of at least [90] 75 percent for an open-book examination administered by the Board on the provisions of NRS and NAC that are related to the practice of chiropractic.
- 2. In addition to the requirements set forth in subsection 1 and NAC 634.350, an applicant for a certificate as a Chiropractic assistant must furnish evidence satisfactory to the Board that he or she:
 - (a) Satisfies one of the following:
- (1) Is certified as a Chiropractic assistant by a program for Chiropractic assistants that is approved by the Board; or
- (2) Has had 6 months of full-time, or 12 months of part-time, training and employment as a Chiropractic assistant trainee from a licensee.
- (b) Has received a score of at least 75 percent for a closed-book examination or a score of at least [90] 75 percent for an open-book examination for certification required pursuant to NAC 634.305.

- 3. Evidence of an applicant's completion of approved training pursuant to subparagraph (2) of paragraph (a) of subsection 2 must consist of a certification by each licensee who supervised the work and training of the applicant.
 - 4. The Board may, at its discretion:
 - (a) Waive one or more of the requirements of this section for good cause shown.
- (b) Upon receipt from an applicant of documentation demonstrating that the applicant has received additional formal training, education or experience, grant the applicant credit toward fulfilling the requirements of subparagraph (2) of paragraph (a) of subsection 2.

NAC 634.360 Employment and training as Chiropractic assistant trainee. (NRS 634.030, 634.123)

- 1. A person may not be employed and trained for more than 15 days as a Chiropractic assistant trainee for the purposes of satisfying subparagraph (2) of paragraph (a) of subsection 2 of NAC 634.355 unless the person, within the first 15 days during which he or she performs any duties as a Chiropractic assistant trainee, applies to the Board by submitting a form provided by the Board.
- 2. Except as otherwise provided in subsection 3, an applicant for a certificate as a Chiropractic assistant who completes training pursuant to subparagraph (2) of paragraph (a) of subsection 2 of NAC 634.355 shall, upon the completion of the training:
 - (a) Apply to the Board to sit for the next scheduled examination; and
 - (b) Submit the fees required by the Board pursuant to NAC 634.200.
- [3. For good cause shown, the Board may, at its discretion, extend the training period of a Chiropractic assistant trainee and authorize the trainee to take a later scheduled examination.]

CONTINUING EDUCATION RANDOM AUDIT

Following the renewal period (December 31), a query will run to randomly select 20% of the active licensed chiropractic physicians and active certified chiropractic assistants. A postcard/notice will be sent to the mailing address on record and to the email address on record for each of the selected licensees and certificate holders.

The continuing education certificates may be provided to the Board by uploading the document(s) through the licensee portal found by going to the Boards website (chirobd.nv.gov), by email, fax or mail.

If the licensee fails to provide his or her continuing education certificates within 30 days of the receipt of the random audit notification, an administrative citation will be issued to a chiropractic physician to include a fine in the amount of \$100.00/unit for the licensee's deficient credits, not to exceed \$1,500.00, and are required to complete the number of deficient continuing education credits within 30 days.

If the certificate holder fails to provide his or her CE certificates within 30 days of the receipt of the random audit notification, an administrative citation will be issued to a chiropractic assistant to include a fine in the amount of \$50.00/unit for the person's deficient credits not to exceed \$500.00 and are required to complete the number of deficient continuing education credits within 30 days.

If the licensee or certificate holder fails to comply with the citation, a Notice of Charges will be issued and disciplinary action will be taken.

A licensee is required to complete 36 hours of continuing education by December 31 of every even year. A chiropractic assistant is required to complete 12 hours of continuing education by December 31 of every odd year. The renewal process requires the licensee and the chiropractic assistant to attest to completing the requisite amount of continuing education hours.

Administrative discipline is reportable to CIN-BAD through FCLB. Disciplinary action is reportable the National Practitioners Databank.

Assembly Bill No. 210-Assemblyman Yeager

CHAPTER.....

AN ACT relating to chiropractic; requiring a business entity that provides chiropractic services to register with the Chiropractic Physicians' Board of Nevada; establishing certain duties of a registrant; revising terminology used to refer to a person who provides chiropractic services; revising certain qualifications of an applicant for a license to engage in the practice of chiropractic; authorizing a chiropractic physician to recommend, dispense or administer certain drugs and devices; creating a privilege for confidential communication between a patient and a chiropractic physician; providing a penalty; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

Existing law regulates the licensing and certification of the practice of chiropractic. (Chapter 634 of NRS) Section 2 of this bill defines "business entity" for the provisions relating to the practice of chiropractic. Section 3 of this bill requires a business entity that provides chiropractic services to register with the Chiropractic Physicians' Board of Nevada. Section 3 requires a business entity to notify the Board of any change to certain information submitted as part of an application for registration. Section 4 of this bill requires a registered business entity to: (1) ensure that all chiropractic physicians and chiropractic assistants who provide chiropractic services in any facility owned or operated by the business entity comply with the provisions of existing law and regulations that govern the practice of chiropractic; (2) establish a written policy and procedure relating to the medical records of a patient; and (3) notify the Board if the business entity dissolves or a facility owned or operated by the business entity closes. Section 6 of this bill requires the Board to keep records relating to registration of a business entity in the same manner as it keeps records of licensing and disciplinary actions. Section 5 of this bill makes a conforming change to indicate the placement of section 2 in the Nevada Revised Statutes.

Existing law provides grounds for initiating disciplinary action against practitioners of chiropractic. (NRS 634.018, 634.140) **Sections 9-15** of this bill make various changes to authorize the imposition of disciplinary action against a registered business entity, as applicable. **Section 18** of this bill makes it a category D felony to own or operate a business entity: (1) that provides chiropractic services without being appropriately registered with the Board; or (2) for which an unlicensed person engages in the practice of chiropractic. **Sections 17 and 19** of this bill make conforming changes to reflect the registration requirement for a business entity that provides chiropractic services.

Existing law requires an applicant for a license to engage in the practice of chiropractic to meet certain requirements. (NRS 634.090) **Section 7** of this bill revises certain requirements relating to the education of an applicant and the successful completion of an examination. **Sections 6, 8, 15-19 and 22** of this bill change the title of a person practicing chiropractic from "chiropractor" to "chiropractic physician" and the title of a person assisting a chiropractic physician from a "chiropractor's assistant" to a "chiropractic assistant."



Existing law prohibits a chiropractic physician from administering or prescribing drugs. (NRS 634.220) **Section 16** of this bill authorizes a chiropractic physician to recommend, dispense or administer any drug or device for which a prescription or order is not required.

Existing law establishes a privilege for a patient to refuse to disclose and prevent any other person from disclosing confidential communication with an allopathic or osteopathic physician or dentist. (NRS 49.215, 49.225) **Section 20** of this bill extends this privilege to apply to confidential communications between a patient and a chiropractic physician.

EXPLANATION - Matter in **bolded italics** is new; matter between brackets formitted material is material to be omitted.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Chapter 634 of NRS is hereby amended by adding thereto the provisions set forth as sections 2, 3 and 4 of this act.

- Sec. 2. "Business entity" means a sole proprietorship or any lawful fictional entity by which business may be conducted lawfully in this State. The term does not include:
- 1. A facility wholly owned by one or more persons licensed pursuant to this chapter or chapter 630 or 633 of NRS;
- 2. A sole proprietorship or partnership that consists solely of persons who are licensed pursuant to this chapter or chapter 630 or 633 of NRS;
- 3. A professional corporation or professional limited liability company, the shares of which are wholly owned by a person or persons licensed pursuant to this chapter or chapter 630 or 633 of NRS;
- 4. An administrator or executor of the estate of a deceased chiropractic physician or a person who is legally authorized to act for a chiropractic physician who has been adjudicated to be incapacitated for not more than 1 year after the date of the death or incapacitation of the chiropractic physician; or
 - 5. A medical facility licensed pursuant to chapter 449 of NRS.
- Sec. 3. 1. To obtain a registration as a business entity that provides chiropractic services, a business entity must submit to the Board an application in the form prescribed by the Board. The application must include:
- (a) The name, address and telephone number of the business entity;
- (\check{b}) The name of any officer or director of the business entity; and



(c) The name of any chiropractic physician who is responsible for providing or supervising the provision of chiropractic services

in any facility owned or operated by the business entity.

2. A registration as a business entity that provides chiropractic services expires on June 1 of each year and may be renewed by submitting to the Board before the expiration of the registration an application for renewal in the form prescribed by the Board.

3. The Board may approve a late application for renewal.

- 4. A business entity shall notify the Board in writing within 30 days after any change to the information described in subsection 1.
- 5. The Board shall impose an administrative fine in an amount prescribed by regulation of the Board against a registrant that does not comply with the requirements of subsection 4.

Sec. 4. A business entity that is registered to provide

chiropractic services pursuant to section 3 of this act shall:

- 1. Ensure that all chiropractic physicians and chiropractic assistants who provide chiropractic services in any facility owned or operated by the business entity comply with the provisions of this chapter or the regulations adopted by the Board, and any other statute or regulation pertaining to the practice of chiropractic;
- 2. Establish a written policy and procedure for the secure storage and transfer of the medical records of a patient and the access to those records by the patient. The policy and procedure must include procedures for:
- (a) Notifying each patient of the location to which his or her medical records will be moved if the business entity ceases operations, is sold or ceases maintaining medical records at the facility where the medical records are currently maintained;

(b) Disposing of unclaimed medical records; and

- (c) Responding to a request by a patient or a representative of the patient for any copy of his or her medical records within the time period prescribed by NRS 629.061.
- 3. Not later than 30 days after the dissolution of the business entity or the closing of any facility owned or operated by the business entity, notify the Board of the dissolution or closure and the procedure by which a patient of the business entity may obtain his or her medical records.
 - **Sec. 5.** NRS 634.010 is hereby amended to read as follows:

634.010 As used in this chapter, unless the context otherwise requires, the words and terms defined in NRS 634.012 to 634.018,



inclusive, and section 2 of this act have the meanings ascribed to them in those sections.

- **Sec. 6.** NRS 634.055 is hereby amended to read as follows:
- 634.055 1. The Board shall keep a record of its proceedings relating to licensing, *registration* and disciplinary actions. Except as otherwise provided in NRS 634.214, the records must be open to public inspection at all reasonable times and must contain the name, known place of business and residence, and the date and number of the license of every [chiropractor] chiropractic physician licensed under this chapter. The Board may keep such other records as it deems desirable.
- 2. Except as otherwise provided in this subsection and NRS 239.0115, all information pertaining to the personal background, medical history or financial affairs of an applicant for licensure or licensee, an officer or director of an applicant for registration or registrant or a chiropractic physician who provides or supervises the provision of chiropractic services at the facility of an applicant for registration or registrant which the Board requires to be furnished to it under this chapter, or which it otherwise obtains, is confidential and may be disclosed in whole or in part only as necessary in the course of administering this chapter or upon the order of a court of competent jurisdiction. The Board may, under procedures established by regulation, permit the disclosure of this information to any agent of the Federal Government, of another state or of any political subdivision of this State who is authorized to receive it.
- 3. Notice of the disclosure and the contents of the information disclosed pursuant to subsection 2 must be given to the [applicant or licensee] person who is the subject of that information.
 - **Sec. 7.** NRS 634.090 is hereby amended to read as follows:
- 634.090 1. An applicant must, in addition to the requirements of NRS 634.070 and 634.080, furnish satisfactory evidence to the Board:
 - (a) That the applicant is of good moral character;
- (b) Except as otherwise provided in subsections [2] 3 and [5,] 6, that the applicant has a high school education and is a graduate from a college of chiropractic which is accredited by the Council on Chiropractic Education, or [which has a reciprocal agreement with the Council on Chiropractic Education or any governmental accrediting agency, whose minimum course of study leading to the degree of doctor of chiropractic consists of not less than 4,000 hours of credit which includes instruction in each of the following subjects:



- (1) Anatomy;
- (2) Bacteriology;
 - (3) Chiropractic theory and practice;
 - (4) Diagnosis and chiropractic analysis;
 - (5) Elementary chemistry and toxicology;
 - (6) Histology;
 - (7) Hygiene and sanitation;
 - (8) Obstetrics and gynecology;
- (9) Pathology;
 - (10) Physiology; and
- (11) Physiotherapy;] its successor organization, or an accrediting agency recognized by that organization; and
- (c) [That] Except as otherwise provided in subsection 2, that the applicant has successfully [:
 - (1) Completed parts completed:
- (1) Parts I, II, III and IV, and the portion relating to physiotherapy, of the examination administered by the National Board of Chiropractic Examiners, or its successor organization; or
- (2) [Completed an] An examination that is required to graduate from a college of chiropractic which is accredited by the Council on Chiropractic Education, or [which has a reciprocal agreement with the Council on Chiropractic Education or any governmental accrediting agency.] its successor organization, or an accrediting agency recognized by that organization. Such an examination must be:
 - (I) Administered by such a college; and
 - (II) Approved by the Board.
- 2. If an applicant has actively engaged in the practice of chiropractic in another state, the District of Columbia, the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico or any other territory or possession of the United States for not less than 7 of the immediately preceding 10 years without any adverse disciplinary action taken against him or her, the applicant is only required to have successfully completed those parts of the examination administered by the National Board of Chiropractic Examiners, or its successor organization, at the time that the applicant graduated from a college of chiropractic.
- **3.** The Board may, for good cause shown, waive the requirement for a particular applicant that the college of chiropractic from which the applicant graduated must be accredited by the Council on Chiropractic Education [or have a reciprocal agreement with the Council on Chiropractic Education or a governmental



accrediting agency.], or its successor organization, or an accrediting agency recognized by that organization.

[3.] 4. Except as otherwise provided in subsections [4] 5 and [5.] 6, every applicant is required to submit evidence of the successful completion of not less than 60 credit hours at an accredited college or university.

[4.] 5. Any applicant who has been licensed to practice in another state, and has been in practice for not less than 5 years, is not required to comply with the provisions of subsection [3.] 4.

- [5.] 6. If an applicant has received his or her training and education at a school or college located in a foreign country [,] and the course of study leading to his or her degree of doctor of chiropractic consisted of not less than 4,000 hours of instruction, the Board may, if the Board determines that such training and education is substantially equivalent to graduation from a college of chiropractic that is accredited by the Council on Chiropractic Education [and otherwise meets the requirements specified in paragraph (b) of subsection 1,], or its successor organization, waive the requirement that an applicant attend or graduate from a college that [:

- [(b) Has a reciprocal agreement with the Council on Chiropractic Education or a governmental accrediting agency.] its successor organization, or an accrediting agency recognized by that organization.

A complaint may be filed anonymously. If a complaint is filed anonymously, the Board may accept the complaint but may refuse to consider the complaint if anonymity of the complainant makes processing the complaint impossible or unfair to the person or entity who is the subject of the complaint.

2. The Board shall retain all complaints filed with the Executive Director pursuant to this section for at least 10 years, including, without limitation, any complaints not acted upon.

- (f) Impose a fine of not more than \$5,000 for each act which constitutes a ground for disciplinary action, which must be deposited with the State Treasurer for credit to the State General Fund.
- The order of the Board may contain such other terms, provisions or conditions as the Board deems proper to remedy or address the facts and circumstances of the particular case.
- 3. If the Board finds that a licensee has violated the provisions of NRS 439B.425, the Board shall suspend the license for a specified period or until further order of the Board.
 - 4. The Board shall not administer a private reprimand.
- 5. An order that imposes discipline and the findings of fact and conclusions of law supporting that order are public records.

- 634.200 1. Any person who has been placed on probation or whose license *or registration* has been limited, suspended or revoked by the Board is entitled to judicial review of the Board's order.

- (a) May continue to provide such services without being registered with the Chiropractic Physicians' Board of Nevada pursuant to section 3 of this act until July 1, 2022; and
- (b) Must be registered pursuant to section 3 of this act if the entity continues to provide such services after that date.
- 2. As used in this section, "business entity" has the meaning ascribed to it in section 2 of this act.

Sec. 22. The Legislative Counsel shall:

- 1. In preparing the Nevada Revised Statutes, use the authority set forth in subsection 10 of NRS 220.120 to substitute appropriately:
- (a) The term "chiropractic physician" for the term "chiropractor" as previously used in reference to the practice of chiropractic; and
- (b) The term "chiropractic assistant" for the term "chiropractor's assistant" as previously used in reference to the practice of chiropractic.
- 2. In preparing supplements to the Nevada Administrative Code, substitute appropriately:
- (a) The term "chiropractic physician" for the term "chiropractor" as previously used in reference to the practice of chiropractic; and
- (b) The term "chiropractic assistant" for the term "chiropractor's assistant" as previously used in reference to the practice of chiropractic.
- Sec. 23. 1. This section becomes effective upon passage and approval.
 - 2. Sections 1 to 22, inclusive, of this act become effective:
- (a) Upon passage and approval for the purpose of adopting any regulations and performing any other preparatory administrative tasks that are necessary to carry out the provisions of this act; and
 - (b) On January 1, 2022, for all other purposes.

STATUS OF CURRENT DISCIPLINARY ACTIONS at April 6, 2023

Disciplinary Action with Probation

1. Casey D. Robinson, DC, License No. B1263

Dr. Robinson was granted a Nevada license on September 14, 2007 under the condition that he comply with all the terms and conditions of his Agreement on Conditions for Licensure with California and monitoring of his practice by Board-appointed Compliance Monitor. Dr. Robinson's 5-year probation with California commenced on February 14, 2006. He was required to reimburse the California Board's costs of \$3,103.75 and serve 4 hours per month of community service for 2-1/2 years of his probation. It was subsequently determined that Dr. Robinson did not comply with the terms and conditions of his agreement with California, which was addressed at the June 4, 2011 meeting and a new Agreed Settlement was approved by this Board to extend his probation for another five years concurrent with and under the same terms and conditions as his settlement agreement with California.

Pursuant to the attached California Board order Dr. Robinson voluntarily surrendered his license effective June 26, 2021. Confirmation was received from the California Board that Dr. Robinson satisfied the terms his California Order with the exception of receiving a passing score on the California law exam.

Dr. Robinson has not been investigated for any reason by the Nevada Board. Does the Board agree that Dr. Robinson be released from probation in Nevada?

2. <u>Michael Milman, DC, License No. B01618</u>

On October 15, 2020 Dr. Michael Milman entered into Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law, and Order with the Board. Dr. Milman will be on probation for five years with a practice monitor who will assure compliance with the terms and conditions of the Order. Dr. Milman was ordered to pay the Board's attorney fees and costs incurred in the investigation and prosecution of this matter totaling \$1,380.00. Dr. Milman must take and pass the Ethics & Boundaries Assessment. Dr. Milman shall maintain malpractice insurance, obtain and maintain all applicable business licensure, whether state, county, or city. Dr, Milman shall not bill any insurances, but work on a cash basis only and cannot accept personal injury cases. Dr. Milman has satisfied all requirements of his Board order, however will remain on probation until November 9, 2025.

Disciplinary Actions with No Probation

3. Mark Taylor, DC, License No. B000460

On February 22, 2023 Dr. Mark Taylor entered into Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law, and Order with the Board. Dr. Taylor was ordered to pay a total fine of \$5,000 (\$1,250 per violation) and pay the Board's fees and costs in the amount of \$3,220.23, both within 60 days of the effective date of this order. Dr. Taylor's license was put in inactive status unless and until Dr. Taylor chooses to reactivate his license, at which time he is required to appear before the Board.

4. Francis Raines, DC, License No. B0187

Under the March 12, 2013 Board Order, Dr. Raines shall be monitored by the Investigating Board Member, a chiropractic physician, and a mental health monitor for 24 months from the date he begins practicing, which occurred on December 8, 2015. Dr. Raines' wife is serving as the business and financial manager and is currently the only employee. Dr. Raines was ordered to pay a fine in the amount of \$20,000.00 and has been making monthly payments of \$75.00 per month since May 30, 2013 and continues to do so. The current balance is \$13,171.00. Dr. Raines is in compliance with the terms of the Order.

Probation Only

5. Todd Gardner, DC, License No. B00495

On October 28, 2021 Dr. Gardner appeared before the Board and was granted his license on probation with conditions. Dr. Gardner shall take and pass the Substance Abuse section of the Ethics & Boundaries Examination, any violations of the court's probationary terms shall constitute a violation of the probation under which Dr. Gardner's license was granted, contract with the Professional Recovery Network who will provide quarterly reports to the Board, Dr. Gardner must provide a quarterly email to the Executive Director reporting his status and Dr. Gardner must report any and all violations of this probation to the Board no later than three days after the violation occurs. Dr. Gardner has taken and passed the Substance Abuse section of the Ethics & Boundaries Examination. Dr. Gardner will be monitored and meet monthly with Mark Chase with the Professional Recovery Program. Reports are attached. Dr. Gardner will remain on probation until February 24, 2025.

PRN AFTERCARE REPORT/NARRATIVE January 31, 2023

> FIRST MONITORING REPORT July – September 2023 October – December 2023

Dear Ms. Strandberg:

Michael Milman, D.C. (Dr. Milman), retained Affiliated Monitors, Inc. (AMI) to monitor his compliance with the terms of a Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law, and Order (Order), issued by the Chiropractic Physicians' Board of Nevada (Board) with an effective date of November 9, 2020. Dr. Milman was licensed to practice chiropractic by the Board on September 12, 2016. He was also similarly licensed in the State of California.

On December 8, 2017, Dr. Milman pled guilty to and was convicted of violating California Penal Code section 550(b)(1) for submitting false or fraudulent insurance claims or statements, which is a criminal felony conviction. The underlying facts involved several medical providers and an attorney by which billing fraud was perpetrated in personal injury actions. A full administrative hearing took place and the California Administrative Law Judge (ALJ) found that the criminal felony conviction and underlying facts merited a revoked chiropractic license for Dr. Milman. The California Board adopted the ALJ decision. On February 18, 2019, Dr. Milman's California chiropractic license was revoked.

That California criminal conviction triggers violations of the Nevada Revised Statues and the Nevada Administrative Code. Dr. Milman failed to inform the Board of the revocation of his California chiropractic license, which is an additional violation. This Board issued the Order based upon the criminal conviction and the failure to report it to the Nevada Board.

The following report sets forth an overview of the Order, which requires a review of patient care and treatment sufficient to allow the monitor to form an opinion as to whether Dr. Milman is practicing chiropractic with reasonable skill and safety to patients. I also described the methodology used in the review, the findings for the record review, and a summary with AMI's conclusions and recommendations.

Overview of Requirements of the Order



Pursuant to the Board Order, Dr. Milman's license was placed on probation for at least five years. During probation, Dr. Milman is subject to the following monitoring requirements:

- A chiropractic physician practice monitor will be appointed and will serve as the monitor throughout the probationary period.
- The practice monitor shall be provided with a copy of the Board's Order and is expected to visit Dr. Milman's practice facilities.
- The viewing of the practice sites as well as the review of fifteen, randomly-selected patient records to assure that the practice complies with all laws applicable to the practice of chiropractic in the State of Nevada.
- The practice monitor will submit quarterly reports to the Board on his or her findings.

The Orders contain other conditions, waivers, and statements of law for failure to comply.

<u>Methodology</u>

AMI's monitor, Ian Yamone, D.C. (Dr. Yamone) serves as the monitor in this matter. His credentials were submitted to the Board and approved. AMI proceeded with the training process for monitoring by Dr. Yamone.

Dr. Milman now resides in Nevada and is practicing at nine different sites for the franchise entitled "The Joint." It is a 100% cash-only basis for treatment. There are 11 locations in the Las Vegas valley. The company utilizes several chiropractors in the treatment of patients and has the chiropractors change locations several times during each week.

At the site visit for this review, the front office provided Dr. Yamone a list of all patients treated by Dr. Milman for the last 90 days. From that list, while on site, Dr. Yamone made random selections for each location worked. The review of the 30 EMR records occurred while Dr. Yamone was at The Joint site. This report covers two quarters' worth of reviewing records to assist in getting Dr. Milman's monitorship going.

The following report details Dr. Yamone's findings and then provides a summary and recommendations.

Monitor's Findings

Description of Patient Records

The patient records were kept in an Electronic Medical Record (EMR). The records were organized and easily searched. Record entries contained essential information about the patient, provider, and the date of service. Emergency contact information for the patient was present in the record. The EMR also contained signed HIPAA acknowledgements.

Problem and Medication Lists

The reviewed patient records included a list of any concurrent health problems. However, no information about the current status of each problem and how it was being addressed was present in the records. Only some of the records included a list of medications, including homeopathic medicines or nutritional supplements.

Nature and History of Presenting Problem



The nature and history of each patient's presenting problem or chief complaint was documented in all of the reviewed files. The records included the nature and location of the patient's presenting symptoms. The severity of symptoms, when the symptoms began, and the event which first produced the symptoms was included in the record. It also included factors which affect the symptom occurrence or the level of severity. Additionally, how each patient's symptoms affected their daily functioning was found in the patient's records. Potentially relevant patient responses to questions about the patient's symptoms were recorded.

The record contained sufficient information about any prior treatment (including home remedies) for the presenting problem. The record included an appropriate and sufficient Review of Systems (ROS) given the nature of the patient's presenting problem.

Medical History and Updates

Patient records included appropriate and sufficient information about the patient's past medical history. Relevant details, such as dates of occurrence, nature of any treatment received, and outcome or current status were captured for each past medical history event recorded. Potentially relevant negative responses to questions about the patient's past medical history were recorded. There was evidence that patient medical information was reviewed, and updates were provided.

The social history taken included information about the patient's exercise and activity level, occupational activities, and illness/injury related concerns. The availability of a support system was also documented.

There was sufficient information about the patient's family medical history, including pertinent negatives, documented in the chart. Patient history was signed by the patient who provided the information. The records demonstrated that Dr. Milman reviewed the patient history information with the patient.

Diagnostic Examination

Records documenting a description of findings derived from appropriate physical examination procedures (palpation, percussion, auscultation) were present in only approximately one-half of the reviewed files. There were no findings derived from the visual observation of the patient (problems with posture and gait) recorded in patient files. The record included performances and results of appropriate evaluation of ranges of motion. The recorded examination findings included narrative descriptions of significant details.

Evaluations that were missed included taking of vital signs, testing of reflex, and gait analysis. There was no documentation concerning the performance and results of appropriate orthopedic and neurological testing.

Assessments and Problem Formulation

Out of the 30 files reviewed, there were only two which contained appropriately documented formulation of assessments. There must be additional neurological and physical examination findings for Dr. Milman to accurately formulate assessments. The rationale in formulating assessments is not apparent in the record. Test results were not present and therefore could not be appropriately factored into an assessment. This led to instances in which significant data were overlooked in every one of the 30 reviewed files.



Treatment Plan

The reviewed treatment plans identified reasonably specific treatment goals, both long-term and short-term. While treatment plans adequately described the anatomical areas to be treated, no treatment modalities were used. There was a proposed timetable for re-evaluation of the patient's progress. There was documented evidence that patients gave informed consent to the treatment. Risks and benefits of the proposed treatment were explained to the patient.

Daily/Progress Notes and Follow-up Care

Daily notes are integrated with progress notes. They contain a description of the condition. This included recording the complaint, frequency, and pain levels. Subjective assessment tools were used. Visual observations and examination findings made by Dr. Milman were recorded. Palpatory findings and subluxations were identified.

The notes provided a sufficiently specific description of the nature of the treatment delivered. It included the duration and intensity of particular treatments. However, changes in the patient's diagnosis or prognosis were not recorded. Dr. Milman did not evaluate any of the patients at the set re-evaluation time.

Site Visit

Dr. Yamane inspected the office at the Montecito Marketplace location of "The Joint" on December 16, 2022. The address is 7120 N. Durango Street, Suite H-170, Las Vegas, Nevada. This location is within a retail space near a Smith's grocery store. The office was well maintained, modern, and clean. There were three adjustment tables situated in an open room. Dr. Milman was the only D.C. present while Dr. Yamane was there.

As part of this site visit, Dr. Yamane reviewed the following forms used at "The Joint": (1) Intake Forms – These included patient information, patient history, patient activity assessment, Terms of Acceptance, Informed Consent to Chiropractic Care, and Notice of Privacy Practices (HIPAA). The actual Intake Form itself was not viewable in the EMR; (2) Rack Card Advertisement – This included plans and pricing, information for military discount, and use of medical savings accounts; and (3) Pueblo Medical Imaging – patient information for x-rays. There is no on-site x-ray.

Summary

This is the first monitoring report by monitor Dr. Yamane concerning practitioner Dr. Michael Milman. It covers two quarters' worth of review of reports so that Dr. Milman can get going on the monitoring portion of his probation. There were delays in getting the monitor chosen and up to speed, as well as educating Dr. Milman on how this probation and monitoring process works. This report covers six months' worth of patient record reviews – from July 2022 through December 2022.

Since Dr. Milman's license to practice chiropractic was placed on probation in Nevada, he has been working at a series of sites for a franchise entitled "The Joint." His schedule is random, and he can be called to work at any of the 11 sites in the Las Vegas area. "The Joint" is on a 100% cash-only basis for chiropractic care. Therefore, Dr. Yamane could not do any review of billing since no insurance companies were billed.

The site visit to the Montecito location by Dr. Yamane showed that the office was well maintained, and he saw no irregularities. Dr. Milman was the only doctor of chiropractic working at that location on the date of the inspection.



The patient records are placed in an electronic medical record (EMR) system. It was easy to follow and to search. It included emergency contact information and a signed HIPAA acknowledgement in each file.

Problem lists included any concurrent health problems. However, no information about the current status of each problem and how it was being addressed was placed in the record.

The nature and history of each patient's presenting problem or chief complaint was documented in all of the reviewed files. The record included an appropriate and sufficient Review of Systems (ROS) given the nature of the patient's presenting problem.

There was sufficient information about the patient's family medical history, including pertinent negatives, documented in the chart. There was evidence that patient medical information was reviewed, and updates were provided.

- 2. <u>Diagnostic Examination</u> Need to include taking of vital signs, testing of reflex, and gait analysis. Need to include documentation concerning the performance and results of appropriate orthopedic and neurological testing.
- 3. <u>Assessments and Problem Formulation</u> There must be additional neurological and physical examination findings for Dr. Milman to accurately formulate assessments. The rationale in formulating assessments needs to be apparent in the record. Test results must be present so that it can be appropriately factored into an assessment.



- 4. Treatment Plan Include information about the treatment modalities.
- 5. <u>Daily/Progress Notes</u> Record changes in the patient's diagnosis or prognosis.

Dr. Milman has been proactive and positive in his interactions with AMI and Dr. Yamane. He has been professional and involved in the process.
